## Voters mark choices in May 5 elections

Voters marked ballots in four area elections on May 5, making choices for boards serving Lynn County Hospital District, Wilson ISD, City of Tahoka, and City of O'Donnell.

O'Donnell will see a new mayor take office, with Mark Roye succeeding Mayor Scotty Martinez, who chose not to seek re-election. Roye won the mayoral race with 120 votes, over challenger Toby Mires, who carried

59 votes. Three seats on the O'Donnell City Council were also up for grabs, with Kyle Pyron leading the ticket with 155 votes, Joseph Luera gaining a seat with 101 votes, and incumbent Kim Parker getting re-elected with 98 votes. Also running were John David Velasquez with 73 votes, April Gloria with 69 votes, and Nympha Renteria with 32 votes.

Lynn County Hospital District will have three new directors on their

Board, with Edward Smith leading the ticket with 303 votes, Connie Donald elected with 258 votes, and Jana Bishop also elected, with 178 votes. The three incumbents running for re-election were all on the ballot as well, including Robbie Autry who carried 175 votes, Della Swartz with 121 votes, and Jannis Childress with 96 votes.

Shiloh Braddock won by a narrow margin of 3 votes in the Tahoka

City Council election for a one-year unexpired term in District 3. He carried 46 votes to 43 votes for incumbent Casey McLelland.

In the Wilson ISD election for two seats on the Board of Trustees, Craig Wilke led the ticket with 61 votes, and incumbent Michael Villarreal was re-elected, carrying 52 votes. Also running were Keith Finke, who had 8 votes, and Michael Davenport, who carried 4 votes.

## Decision reversed ... Lamesa Clinic project stopped, after new vote from LCHD Board

The Lynn County Hospital District has withdrawn plans to open a rural health clinic in Lamesa, after the Board of Directors in a special session last Thursday voted 5-0 to rescind their original vote on April 26 that had allowed Interim CEO Steve Brock to secure investors and sign a lease for a building in Lamesa to be renovated for the clinic project. The new vote effectively stops any LCHD plans for the project.

The Board of Directors had voted 3-2 on April 26 to proceed with the plans for the clinic project, with Della Swartz, Sharon Isham and Jannis Childress voting in favor, and W. Calloway Huffaker and Mary Gayle Raindl voting against. Directors Manuel DeLeon and Robbie Autry had been absent from the April 26 meeting and therefore did not cast a vote on the clinic project.

After that meeting, one of the directors asked for a special session in order to reconsider the vote on the issue. A special session was held a week

later, on Thursday, May 3, for the sole purpose of reconsidering the Lamesa Clinic project.

At that meeting, five of seven directors were present for the meeting, including W. Calloway Huffaker, who presided at the meeting due to the absence of Board President Jannis Childress, Manuel DeLeon, Robbie Autry, Mary Gayle Raindl, and Sharon Isham. Director Della Swartz, along with Childress, was absent from the May 3 meeting.

A good number of citizens, estimated as many as 60, also attended the meeting which included opportunity for comments during a public forum.

Following the public forum, during which comments were heard both in favor of and against the project, Autry put forth a motion, seconded by Isham, to rescind the Board's April 26 vote and to effectively stop any progress with the Lamesa clinic project. All five directors who were present voted 5-0 in favor.

The meeting adjourned immediately after the motion was approved.

## Two sentenced to jail time in district court proceedings

Four cases, against two defendants, were heard in 106th District Court before the Honorable Judge Carter T. Schildknecht in Lynn County last Tuesday, May 1, with the following assessments:

• Shawn Strevel, 35, assessed punishment of 5 years in Texas Department of Criminal Justice facility with 115 days time credited, plus payment of court costs, for a charge of possession of marijuana on Jan. 6, 2018. A second case on Strevel was dismissed, due to punishment from the first case assessed.

• Enchantra Lopez, judgment revoking community supervision from original date of May 2, 2017; assessed punishment of 2 years in TDCJ with 136 days time credited, plus payment of court costs, for a charge of Failure To Appear on Dec. 17, 2010. Another judgment revoking community super-

vision was from charges of possession of a controlled substance, to-wit, cocaine, on April 2, 2010; original punishment assessed was 2 years TDCJ and 2 years community supervision, on May 2, 2017; assessed punishment of 8 months TDCJ with 136 days time credited.

Vandalism, littering, and an attempted break-in at New Home ISD were in reports from law enforcement this week.

A call came in at 9:22 a.m. Monday, May 7, reporting evidence of an attempted break-in at New Home ISD campus. Damage to an entry door on the east side of the building, between the ag building and the science building, was reported, as evidence of someone trying to pry open the door. Entry was not gained inside the building, however.

**ACT Board considering name change to Tahoka Economic Development Board**

The ACT Board met with all members present on Thursday, May 3, at 5:15 p.m. at City Hall. Gary Jones, Carmen Chapa, Julia Allen, Tim Pledger, Joe Craig and Bill Schoemann all attended, with Jerry Webster serving as the Executive Director.

The ACT Board, after reviewing the bank statements, found that no interest was being paid on the funds deposited in the account. After discussion with First National Bank of Tahoka and the ACT Board, it was approved unanimously to

move the funds into an interest bearing account.

The Board also unanimously approved the idea of a name change from Advancing the Community of Tahoka (ACT) to the Tahoka Economic Development Corporation. The City Attorney informed the Board they must approve the name change and change the By Laws, then submit a letter to the Tahoka City Council. If the Council approves, then it will be submitted to the State for the correction.

The Board discussed the change in the façade program

wording, defining the definition of a business and excluding all properties that use the buildings as storage. The change will be submitted before City Council for approval.

A webpage design was presented to the Board for consideration. Adventure Marketing from Brownfield provided information and costs for a webpage that will be created to help market the City of Tahoka and the County of Lynn. The Board requested a contract be provided for consideration.

A Film Friendly Community designation was discussed during the meeting. Bill Schoemann had attended a workshop in Plainview where the Office of the Governor provided information about listing the City of Tahoka on the State's Website. The State maintains a list of "Film Friendly Communities" and when commercials or the movie industries are looking for specifics on a community, they scroll the State's webpage that lists the communities. Not only would the city have to adopt ordinances, photos of the community and county would be uploaded to the State's webpage and that is how the movie "industry" knows what a community has to offer. Gary Jones has agreed to explore this opportunity and will report back next month. The advantages economically to having the exposure of the City would outweigh any inconveniences should the City benefit from having a movie or commercial shot locally.

The ACT Board also discussed the idea of being an environmentally friendly community discussing the opportunities that recycling may provide and the economic impact to a community.

Anyone interested in developing or expanding an idea or a business in the city or county are encouraged to contact the board. All citizens are welcome and encouraged to attend.

**WATER LINE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT UPDATE**

The project is approximately 85% complete. The last long run left is Lockwood Street. The contractor has begun the process of connecting all of the new lines and abandoning the old lines. During the last scheduled shut down the contractor was able to make six tie-ins, but they have several more to do.

When the water system is shut down and then restarted, you will experience some unusual things at your residence:

1. There will be air in your water line. This is caused by the lines being partially drained before and during the tying-in process. Air in your line can cause a hammering effect and can knock rust loose from old lines when they are being refilled. It can also cause the water fill hose in your toilet tank to come out and spray water. At my house I turn 1 or 2 faucets on very low, but enough to allow the air to escape during the shut-down period. This seems

to help after the water is turned back on.

2. Your water may be cloudy. This is caused by several things, including air being mixed with water. Before the new lines can be tied in they have to be pressured up and chlorinated. Samples have to be pulled and taken to the laboratory. Once the samples are "clean" the lines are flushed and can be tied in at any time. Cloudiness will clear up if you run your water. How long you have to run your water for it to clear up varies from house to house. At my house it took 24 hours.

If your water stays cloudy, if it is brown or yellow, or if little flakes of rust are in your water, you might want to check your service line. Some houses have old galvanized lines from the meter into the house, and the hammering from the air can shake a lot of things off that end up in your house. If you have old lines you should replace them. If you have these problems please call and let us know.

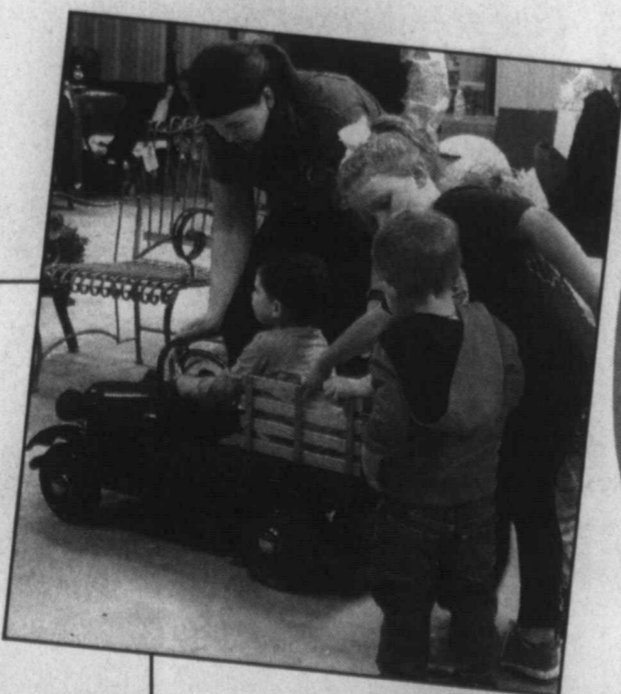

**Lynn County 4-H'ers have great livestock judging season**

This spring, Lynn County 4-H Livestock Judging Teams competed in five 4-H contests across the state of Texas. The spring season started at the Texas Tech Invitational where the Intermediate Team of Bryson Stone, Kaylee Walker, Tanner Clark and Pace Ritz were 4th. Bryson Stone was the 8th High Individual.

"This was a tough contest, but a good chance to get our kids out and see animals in person. For our junior teams, this was their first real contest to compete in," said Lynn County Extension Agent Wade Howard.

On April 3rd, the Intermediate team of Bryson Stone, Laine Cook, Tanner Clark and Kaylee Walker traveled to Graham where the Young County Livestock Judging Invitational was held. A strong performance resulted in the team winning by a margin of 34 points. Individual placings included: Stone- 1st, Cook - 2nd, Walker- 8th, and Clark 10th.

A short 4 days later, 9 Lynn County 4-Hers made the trip to the Clarendon College Livestock Judging Contest. The team of Bryson Stone, Laine Cook, Tanner Clark and Kinlee Rathmann won out of a field of 56 teams to bring home Champion Team Honors. Stone was also named High Individual in the contest. Livestock Judging Coach Will Pettit had this to say about the contest, "I was extremely proud of the kids for their performance at Clarendon. This contest is one of the largest in the state, and it was a proud moment when they brought home first place honors. The kids worked hard all year and it was exhibited that day."

After a week of practice, the teams were on the road again, this time in full force. 27 Lynn County 4-Hers competed at the South Plains College Contest in Levelland. The team of Bryson Stone, Laine Cook, Braden Stone, and Brook Tyson put up a score of 1799, which was

enough to be the 2nd place 4-H team. Braden Stone was 9th in the 4-H Contest.

Lynn County 4-Hers wrapped up their judging season with the District 2 Livestock Judging Contest, held on the campus of Texas Tech University. Lynn County was well represented with 28 4-Hers competing in the contest. In the Junior Division, the team of Brogan Stone, Casen Clark, Kinlee Rathmann and Jaityn Mires earned High Team honors, and the team of Lincoln Graham, Remi Donald, Garrett Sanders and Jady Woodley were 3rd. Brogan Stone was the 3rd High Junior Individual, while Jady Woodley was 4th and Casen Clark was 7th. In the Intermediate Division, the team of Bryson Stone, Laine Cook, Kaylee Walker and Tanner Clark had their best day of the year and won by 75 points. Bryson Stone was also named High Individual and brought home a new belt buckle, and Laine Cook was 4th.

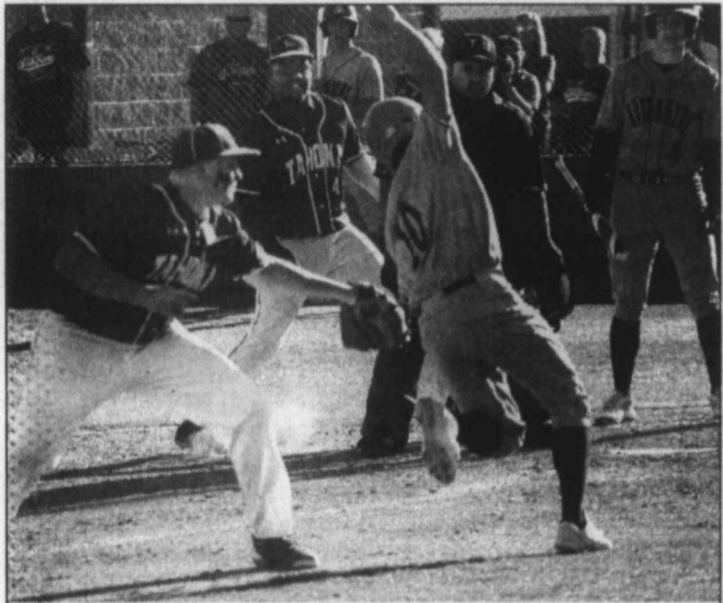
**Bands set final performances in old THS auditorium**

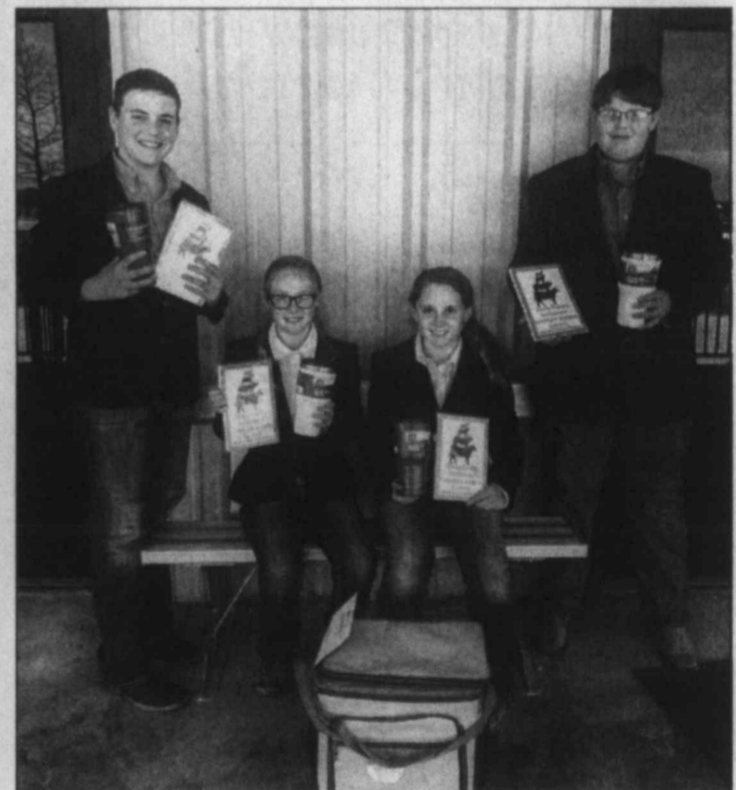
