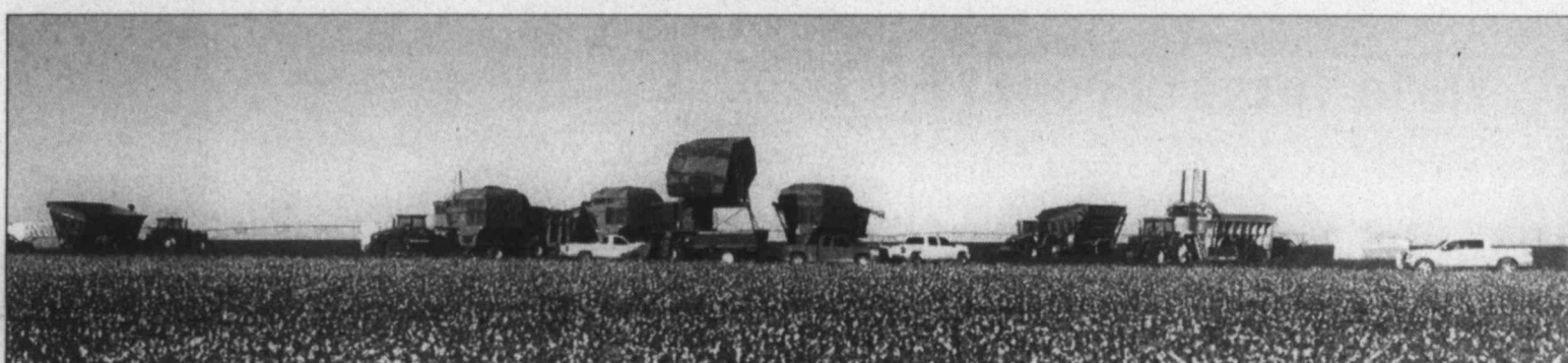

The New Home community came together this week to harvest the cotton crop of the Fillingim family after the family suffered a tragedy in September. A large group of neighbors and friends of the family brought the cotton in to New Home Coop Gin on Tuesday.

Wayne Fillingim, 68, and his wife Vickie, were building a retirement home at Lake Stamford, both of them inside doing finishing work, when the house suddenly exploded about 3:20 p.m. on Thursday, September 13, with flames and debris flying throughout the home. Wayne was airlifted to a Lubbock hospital, and Vickie was transported by ambulance, both for treatment of injuries and burns suffered in the explosion. Wayne later succumbed to his injuries, and died Sept. 15, 2018.

Wayne is the son of A.C. Fillingim of New Home.

Wayne's widow, Vickie, and her father-in-law A.C. Fillingim express their deepest appreciation to the New Home community for their compassion, generosity and hard work in harvesting the cotton crop.

Tahoka to face Vega in bi-district playoffs

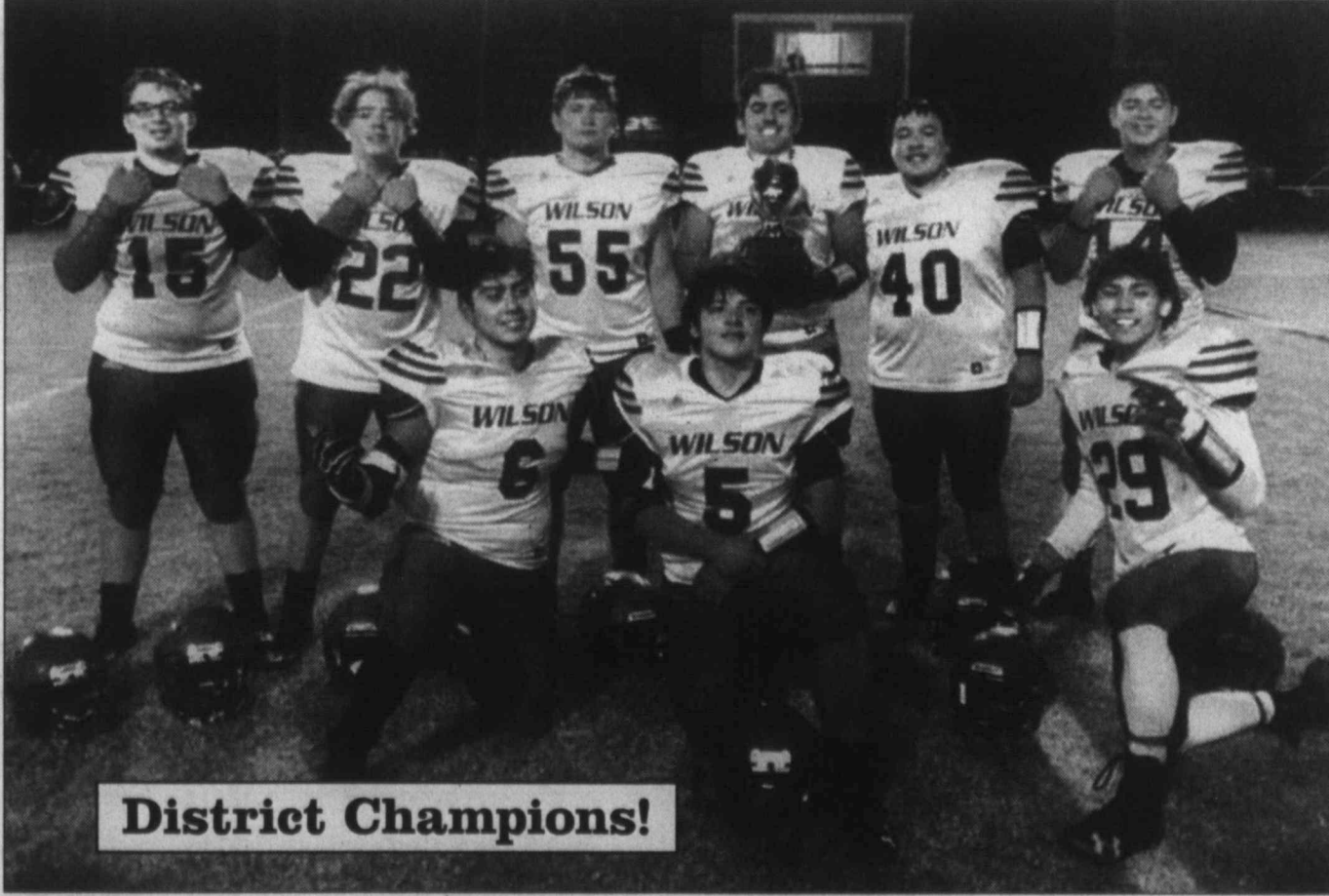

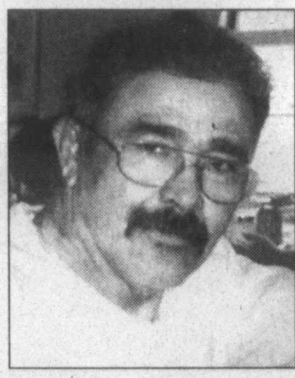


Ruby L. Goforth

Dan Seale re-elected HPWD Pct 1 Director

Dan Seale of Lubbock was re-elected Precinct One District Director for the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District (HPWD), according to unofficial returns from the Nov. 6 general election.

Unofficial results show Seale with 39,209 votes to 18,058 votes for Paul Bjerk of Lubbock. Bjerk is an associate professor of history at Texas Tech University. Seale, a retired HPWD employee, will serve a second four-year term representing the portion of Crosby County above the Caprock Escarpment within the district, all of Lubbock County, and all of Lynn County.

The Board of Directors will canvass the election returns and declare the results official during a special meeting on Nov. 20 at 1:30 p.m. at the HPWD office, 2930 Avenue Q, in Lubbock.

Created in 1951 by local residents and the Texas Legislature, the High Plains Water District works to conserve, preserve, protect, and prevent the waste of underground water within its 16-county service area. HPWD is the first ground-water conservation district created in Texas.

1,701 ballots cast in county in Nov. 6 Election

Just over 1700 voters cast ballots in the Nov. 6 General Election last week, with 1,701 ballots cast, including 698 ballots cast during the early voting period. That number is 43% of the 3,943 total registered voters in the county.

All eight of the Lynn County offices on the ballot had unopposed candidates, including the County Judge (Mike Braddock), County Clerk (Susan Tipton), District Clerk (Sandra Laws), County Treasurer (Amy Schuknecht), Justices of Peace for Precincts 1 (Christie Oliván) and 4 (Ed Follis), and Commissioner Precincts 2 (John Hawthorne) and 4 (Larry Durham). These terms of office will commence on Jan. 1, 2019, for four-year terms.

Reed Filley of Tahoka was unopposed in his bid for the 106th District Judge seat on the Nov. 6 ballot, and he received 1,397 votes. His four-year term of office will also commence on Jan. 1, 2019.

All local offices were on the Republican ticket. In Lynn County, 731 voters cast straight-party Republican ballots, and 190 cast straight party Democratic ballots.

Lynn County voters chose Ted Cruz (REP) for U.S. Senator with 1,368 votes, giving Beto O'Rourke (DEM) 323 votes and Neal Dikeman (LIB) 5 votes.

For U.S. Representative, District 19, Lynn County voters chose Jodey Arrington (REP) with 1,392 votes, and giving 295 votes to Miguel Levario (DEM).

In the District 83 State Representative race, Dustin Burrows (REP) carried Lynn voters with 1,335 votes, while Drew Landry (DEM) received 342.

Gov. Greg Abbott (REP) carried 1,379 votes in Lynn County, compared to 302 votes for Lupe Valdez (DEM), and 14 votes for Mark Jay Tippetts (LIB). For Lt. Governor, Dan Patrick (REP) carried 1,159 votes, Mike Collier (DEM) had 480, and Kerry Douglas McKennon (LIB) had 41 votes.

For Attorney General, Ken Paxton (REP) had 1,282 votes, Justin Nelson (DEM)

had 364, and Michael Ray Harris (LIB) had 32 votes. Glenn Hegar (REP) carried the Comptroller of Public Accounts race with 1,322 votes, with Joi Chevalier (DEM) getting 294 votes, and Ben Sanders (LIB) 47.

Sid Miller (REP) carried the Commissioner of Agriculture race in Lynn County with 1,314 votes, Kim Olson (DEM) had 329, and Richard Carpenter (LIB) had 24. George P. Bush (REP) carried the Commissioner of

the General Land Office race with 1,329 votes here, Miguel Suazo (DEM) had 284, and Matt Pina (LIB) had 51. For Railroad Commissioner, Christi Craddick (REP) had 1,326 votes here, Roman McAllen (DEM) had 296, and Mike Wright (LIB) had 45.

In the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1's election for a Director, Pct. 1, Lynn voters chose Dan Seale with 702 votes, and Paul Bjerk had 223 votes.

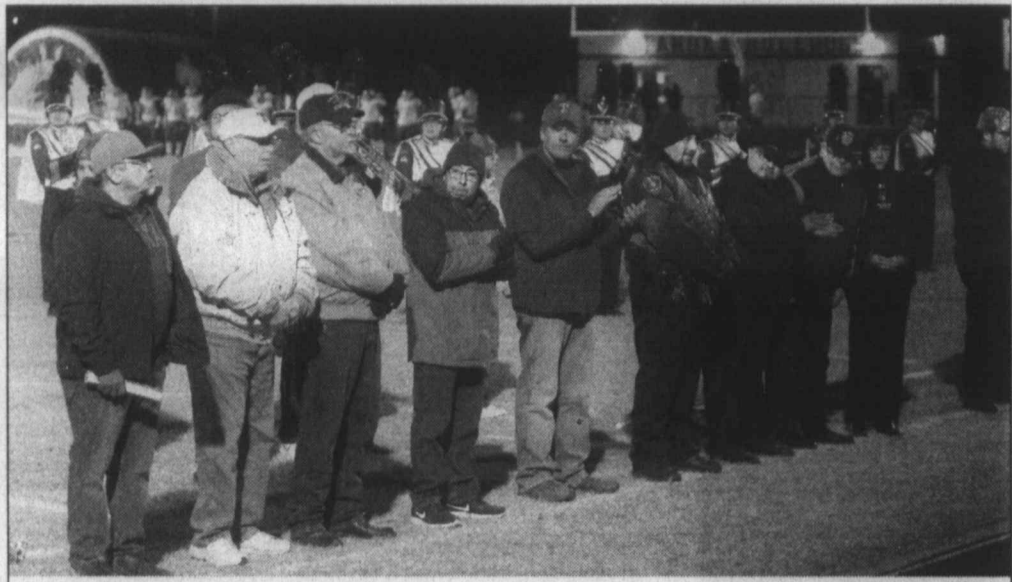

Traffic accidents, thefts reported in county

A couple of traffic accidents and other incidents were in Lynn County Sheriff's Office call sheet reports this week.

On Nov. 6, Stanley Forbes

reported he was in an accident with no injuries reported at 1st and Doak St. in O'Donnell at 8:05 a.m.. Forbes was the driver of a red Ford F-150 that collided with a Chevrolet vehicle, driver's name not reported.
