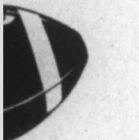

Eagle of Honor Project

From people who think freedom should never be taken for granted

For many years, especially after September 11th, there has been talk in Lynn County about developing an up to date memorial honoring those service members who have sacrificed their time, energy, efforts, and sometimes their lives, to preserve and protect the freedom that Americans enjoy today. A project called the "Eagle Of Honor Project" is being planned for just such a memorial that will stand on the Lynn County Courthouse grounds.

A group of citizens, along with the support of the Commissioners' Court of Lynn County, are raising money to develop a military memorial to be called the "Eagle of Honor Project" to be located on the northwest corner of the soon-to-be courthouse square in Tahoka.

Freedom is a gift to be treasured but it comes with the sacrifices of the men and women who were drafted or enlisted to serve in America's armed forces. The sacrifices are not just felt by the service members, but their wives, husbands, mothers, fathers, brothers and sisters and families. The Eagle of Honor project will honor and

salute those service members of the past, present and future generations with the flags from the Army, Navy, Marines, National Guard, Air Force, Coast Guard, POW/MIA (prisoners of war/ missing in action) flag with the American Flag standing proudly above. A bronze Eagle of Honor, depicting an eagle wrapped in an American Flag, will sit on a bricked podium with the service flags adorning the memorial.

The goal is to raise the \$35,000 necessary to purchase the bronze eagle, the flag poles and flags, the brick and concrete, the electrical/lighting and the military branch emblems. A fund has been estab-

lished at three county banking facilities: First National Bank of Tahoka, First Bank and Trust at Tahoka/Wilson and State National Bank in O'Donnell. Every donation, regardless of amount, will be greatly appreciated and will help to truly honor the military service members.

The Eagle of Honor fund raising committee consists of John Baker, Jerry Webster, Mike Braddock, Pam Hilger and Susan Tipton of Tahoka, Terry Laws of Grassland, Sharon Isham of Wilson, Stina Nieman of New Home, and an O'Donnell representative as yet unnamed. Anyone who would like to join these fund raising efforts is encouraged to contact any of these members.

"Our goal is to encourage every individual, business, school, the Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Rotary and Masonic Lodge and every social service organization to adopt this as a fund raising project

to honor and thank those service members and their families for their service and sacrifice. America is a strong and proud country and freedom is not free. Freedom is a gift to be treasured but it comes with a sacrifice. Please do your part to honor our men and women of Lynn County and all service members by supporting this cause," said a project sponsor.

"As we look back at our history, examine the present and gaze sternly into the future, there is one thing that is certain. We are a resilient Country. Our men and women always respond to the call for service. Lynn County is no different. Residents from Lynn County have served in every war and conflict that our Presidents have required of its citizens. Blood, sweat and tears were sacrificed because our freedom has been at stake. The Eagle of Honor will serve to honor those men and women of the past, present

New hire approved by Tahoka ISD Board

The Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees met in regular session Tuesday, Nov. 13, accepting the resignation of Middle School Social Studies teacher Pam Martin, and approving a contract for David Burton to fill the vacated position.

The Board appointed Blake Moore to represent Tahoka ISD on the Lynn

County Appraisal District Board, and accepted a plan for Tahoka Middle School for a pilot program with Education Service Center 17 for continuous improvement in the middle school reading and math programs.

Trustees authorized Supt. Dick Van Hoose to issue a request for qualifications for architect firms interested in assisting the district in the possible planning, designing and administering for capital improvement projects for 2019-2020, and approved a construction delivery method that provides the best value to the district for potential capital improvement projects. The superintendent told The News that potential projects may be considered to take advantage of the impact of the added values from wind turbine projects.

Supt. Van Hoose presented an update on the current construction project at the school, which he says is anticipated to be completed for the most part by the beginning of 2019. Some delays have been caused by auditorium seating, which had to be reordered when the first com-

pany closed and a new source was required, but the seats are expected to be delivered in December. Another delay was in the installation of new windows on the elementary campus, that was caused when incorrect sizes were delivered to the project. Asphalt paving for parking areas will be completed as weather allows.

Monthly bills were approved, and campus reports were presented.

All trustees were present for the meeting, including Board President Clay Taylor, Doug Green, Jon Luna, Blanda Watt, Drew Stone, Lea Swinford and Slate May.

Commissioners approve year-end audit

Lynn County Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, November 13, at 9:30 a.m. at the County Judge's Office located at 1524 Harper Street. Commissioners Matt Woodley, John Hawthorne, Don Blair and Larry Durham were present with County Judge Mike Braddock presiding.

The 2018 county audit and Annual Financial Report FY ending September 30, 2018 was approved as presented, with auditors noting that Lynn County received a clean opinion.

Commissioners voted unanimously to approve the First Amendment to the Tax Abatement Agreement be-

tween The County of Lynn, Texas and Sage Draw Wind, LLC.

Tahoka Animal Control Director Jesse Calvillo was appointed by County Commissioners as the Local Rabies Control Authority, and commissioners accepted TxDOT road supplement materials in the amount of \$18,230 under HB 1, Rider 19. Commissioner Precincts 1 and 3 will receive the materials this year, with Pct. 2 and 4 to be the recipients the following year.

Commissioners approved a portion of Capital Credits received by Lynn County could be used for the Eagle of Honor Project that will honor

military men and women in Lynn County, and approved opening a Special Checking Account at First Bank and Trust for the Eagle of Honor Project.

Commissioners approved the firm of Bolinger, Segars, Gilbert and Moss.LLP to perform the State Audit for the Restoration Fund, at a cost of approximately \$5,000. A portion of the expense will be refunded by the State Historical Commission.

Monthly bills were approved, and County Clerk Susan Tipton asked the Commissioners to canvass the votes for the Nov. 6 General Election on Monday, November 19 at 8:30 a.m.

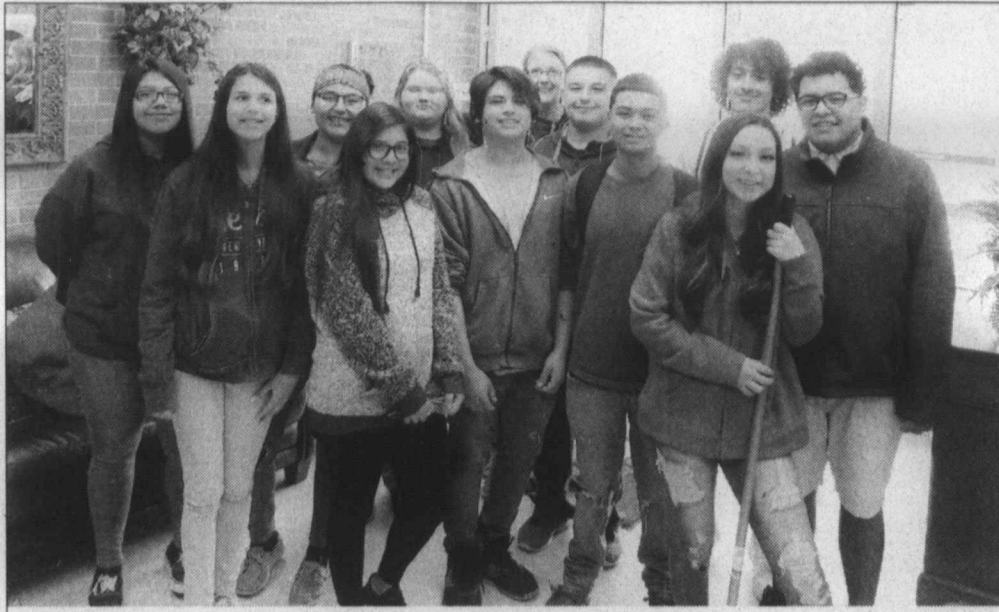

Capital Farm Credit returns \$50 million to borrowers

BRYAN, Texas – Capital Farm Credit's Board of Directors recently approved a \$50 million cash retirement of remaining allocated equities issued in 2011. Borrowers with loans in 2011 will receive their share of the cash payment in checks mailed this week.

The \$50 million represents more than 56 percent of

the remaining earnings from 2011, leaving a balance of 2011 earnings after the retirement of \$38,208,000. Bulldogs fall to Longhorns 31-26

The Bulldogs' season came to an end Friday night as they fell to the Vega Longhorns 31-26 at Canyon's Kimbrough Memorial Stadium in the Bi-District round of the UIL playoffs in Dist. 4-2A Div II. This was a very back-and-forth game all night as the Bulldogs held the lead 13-12 at the half, but came up short in the end.

Vega opened the scoring with an 82-yard TD in the first quarter. Early in the second quarter, Malik Hamilton ran for an 8-yard TD to put Tahoka on the board, then the Longhorns answered with another TD. Tahoka's John Stone ran for a 5-yard TD and Javier Zuniga added the PAT, for the Bulldogs to lead 13-12 at the half.

Vega added two more TDs early in the second half, but Tahoka caught up with a Braden Stone pass to John Stone for a TD, and then Malik Hamilton ran for a 72-yard TD that put Tahoka in the lead 26-25 with 2:54 remaining in the game. With just over a minute left, Vega's Carson Kirkland ran for a 49-yard TD that gave Vega the 31-26 win.

"This was a game that we let slip away from us," said Coach Stephen Overstreet. "We did some really good things on both sides of the ball and we did some really bad things as well. Unfortunately those bad things came at the wrong time and Vega was able to capitalize. Offensively we did a really good job of running the ball and we threw the ball well enough to keep them off-balanced. We played good on defense but allowed too many big plays on third down. We gave up an 82-yard TD reception to open the scoring for

Vega on a busted coverage on like 3rd and 17. We got those things corrected and didn't allow much through the air the rest of the night but still struggled in crucial times getting off the field.

"We did make some big stops and we did force Vega to punt a few times which was huge, but the times we needed to get them the most we didn't. Offensively we felt we could get the edge on them and run our sweep play effectively. Vega made some good adjustments defensively at the half and we had to adjust in the second half. We had some offensive possessions that we would like to have back. Vega started bringing some pressure and we didn't do a very good job of picking it up. We also had some drives that we would march the field at will then stall out.

"This group played hard all year and did some really good things. The result of Friday night stinks and nobody is happy with it. These kids showed up in August and set out on a mission to do something that hasn't been done in a long time. We came up short but still have a lot to be proud of. We ended the season with a winning record, we won as many district games this season as we did the previous five years combined, and we get 18 lettermen back next season.

Obviously every team in the state but one is happy at the end. This group showed a lot of maturity and growth and I am super proud of them. The work that was done behind the scenes can't be measured by wins and losses. These guys made a commitment and set out to reach a goal. In football just like life sometimes we fall short. When that happens you have two choices you can either give up and quit or you can wipe your tears away and show back up to work. As long as I'm here we will show back up to work. We will never let a situation define us we are going to let it drive us this off-season and summer," stressed the coach.

"We want to say a huge thank you for the love and support this season. The attendance we had a games this season both home and away, and the outpouring of support shown during the weeks by so many different people and groups is a blessing. It's so much easier to show up and work hard when you know that regardless of the outcome you have a FAMILY that has your back. We are very thankful for each and every one of you, and would like to wish you all a Happy Thanksgiving and Merry Christmas. May your holiday season be as blessed as the blessing you have given this team since August," said Overstreet.
