Clovis Man Killed During Robbery

Ron Culbert, 23, employee of the Alsop 7-11 Grocery Store, located at 7th and Hondo in Clovis, was found dead in the back room of the building at approximately 11:45 p.m. (MST) Tuesday by officer Harry Mason who responded to the silent burglar alarm system from the business.

Culbert, apparently closing the store at the time he was shot, was hit in the chest by a blast from a shotgun and was dead when officers arrived. An autopsy was performed Wednesday morning, according to District

Attorney Morris Stagner. The sum of \$868.83 was taken in the holdup. Road blocks were set up in the surrounding area and one person was stopped near Friona with a shotgun in the car. However, the suspect was absolved of any guilt of the crime.

No arrests have been made at this time, Stagner said.

Investigation is continuing into the shooting and robbery.

Culbert was the grandson of Mrs. Z. M. Burris and a relative of other residents of Muleshoe.

Fire Closes Freeman's Cafe

Freeman's Drive - In Restaurant, located next door west of the Shamrock Service Station on West American Blvd., is closed for repairs.

Fire broke out in the kitchen last Wednesday morning, burning out the interior and destroying all the kitchen equipment.

Harold Freeman, owner of the restaurant, said "I had gone from the kitchen to the front to take a telephone order and when I returned to the kitchen, sparks were flying from a short in the electric wiring over the fryolator.

"The sparks in the grease in the Fryolator soon became a fire which resulted in the destruction of the kitchen and equipment.

"The most extensive damage was done in that part of the building, however, the flames leaped out through the serving window, damaging that immediate area. Smoke damage was evident throughout the building."

School Tax Collection Nears Three-Fourths Mark

A total of 73.36 percent of the school taxes have been collected to date, according to the report of the Muleshoe Independent School District Board of Trustees after a meeting held Monday.

A tax report revealed that \$392,972.18 of the 1967 taxes had been collected, less discount of \$11,420.11. Penalty and interest collected were \$1,351.33 and delinquent tax collected stand at \$5,929.16,

bringing the total to \$388,832.56.

The Board accepted the resignation of O. E. Lumsden, Elementary School Counselor, effective December 14. Lumsden has accepted a counseling position with Civil Service at Brigham City, Utah.

Number of students who ride school buses as of December 1 total 764. The largest number of students riding one bus is 73 and the smallest number is 28.

On bus number one, 49 students ride; Number two has 36; Number three has 73; Number four has 28; Number 5 has 33; Number six has 32; Number seven has 47; Number 8 has 60 and Number nine has 66.

Bus 10 has 50 riders; Number 11 has 47; Number 12 has 42; Number 13 has 56; Number 27 has 57 and Number 28 has 59.

Approval was made requisitioning of three new school buses through the State Board of Control. Two are 48 passenger and one 60 passenger.

Two will be requisitioned in January and the third one at a later bid opening.

Three months library circulation report showed that more books were checked out in October than the preceding month or November.

In September 5,557 were checked out; October list shows a total of 8,239 and November 7,466.

This brings the three months period total to 21,262.

This year athletic income from football and basketball is \$8,810.04 compared to \$8,112.55. Football income this year figures \$8,323.08 compared to the 1966 total of \$7,641.70. Basketball for 1967 is \$486.95 compared to \$470.85 last year.

Enrollment comparison shows 128 less students attending school this year than last year.

FIRST IN PANHANDLE City Sales Tax Passed: Kendrick Wins Race

Despite miserable weather conditions Saturday, a total of 307 votes were cast in the municipal election for the city sales tax which carried by a margin of 153 votes.

Ballots cast during the voting hours tallied 230 for the sales tax and 77 against.

These projects were outlined in the Journals prior to the election date.

Muleshoe is the first city in the Panhandle area to call a city sales tax election, although numerous towns in south and east Texas have passed the tax in elections, while few have rejected the issue where the votes have been cast. Other Panhandle towns have such election dates set and some are in the process of doing so.

Icy Death Grip Releases Area

Wintry weather released its death grip on the area slightly Monday afternoon and Tuesday saw the city streets undergo a more thawing condition than had been evidenced since freezing drizzle tacked down a solid carpet of ice beneath a snowfall which began early last Thursday morning.

During the past six-day period, more than six inches of snow continued to stay on the ground as the mercury sea-sawed up and down the temperature gauges.

Christmas shoppers have been hampered, driving warnings issued ranged from 'extremely hazardous' to 'drive with caution.'

Pedestrians suffered the brunt of the icy ground conditions with one dead of exposure and three hospitalized, all attributed to weather.

No auto accident fatalities were recorded during this mid-December arctic snow and ice storm in Bailey County.

A number of 'fender-bender' type accidents have occurred resulting in damage to vehicles involved.

Haskell Milligan, Goodland area farmer, died from exposure 100 yards away from the Earl Bowers home between 8 p.m. and 10 p.m. Thursday night and was found around 8:30 a.m. Friday by Bowers and a farm hired hand, Richard Lebow.

Milligan is the only victim, to date, whose death is attributed to the weather within the county.

Forecasters' predictions include another storm in the making with snow falling in western New Mexico late Tuesday and spreading eastward. A new storm predicted for Sunday did not materialize in this area.

However, wind gusting to near 80 miles per hour struck as a front moved through Texas and into Louisiana around 10 p.m. Sunday night.

Some rain and Sleet fell with the leading edge of the front.

The Panhandle continues under the threat of additional severe weather conditions.

Bailey County Electric Cooperative's line department dispatched a crew of six (6) men and four (4) trucks to Rio Grande Electric Cooperative where lines were devastated by recent ice storms.

This line crew, consisting of Seth Shaw, foreman; Clovis Windham, lineman; Larry Combs, second class lineman; Eugene Wittner, lineman; Ray Terrill, special helper and Austin Floyd, hole digger operator, will be quartered in Marfa, and will function as a unit with assistance from local system, repairing damage in that area.

\$420,000 Loan Granted Cooperative

(Special to the Journal)

A \$420,000 loan has been approved for the Bailey County Rural Electric Cooperative by the Rural Electric Association in Washington, Congressman Bob Price announced.

This loan added to \$129,444 from a prior REA loan will furnish 49 miles of distribution lines for 360 new consumers and three miles of 69 Kilo-Volt transmission lines plus additions to the system's improvements.

The improvements will include 18 miles of new tie lines and conversion of 68 miles of existing lines and related facilities.

Loan funds will also finance the installation of a \$5,000 KVA sub-station near Morton.

A portion of the loan will reimburse borrowers from the general fund expended on previous approved construction.

The first five and one half years were spent on a farm near Vassar, Kan. In August, 1923, they moved to New Wells, Mo., where Herb Pieman taught the lower grades in a two room Lutheran school and did some supervised study toward the ministry. Ordained at Cisco on July 5, 1925, he has spent 42 years in the ministry shepherding churches in Cisco, Vernon, Borger, and since 1964, the church at Lariat.

He has an older brother and two sisters living at Vassar and Topeka, Kan. and she has a 99-year-old aunt Amelia also living at Vassar.

"The past 50 years have brought their fair share of both joy and sorrow," Madge commented. "Probably the grief that hurt most was the loss of our two-year-old son, Herbie, and of another son at birth. But the joys have always by far outweighed the sorrow. All in all, we have lived a very rewarding life. I wouldn't trade the role of a minister's wife for any profession in the world. My husband feels the same way about the ministry."





Four Accidents Investigated In County

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated four accidents on rural highways in Bailey County during the month of November, according to Sergeant Thurman Keffer, Highway Patrol Supervisor of this area.

These crashes resulted in one person injured and an estimated property damage of \$2,300.

The rural accident summary for this county during the first eleven months of 1967 shows a total of 58 accidents resulting in three persons killed, 26 persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$45,239.

DEADLY COMBINATION The Throttle and Bottle

Christmas, with the deepest spiritual significance, is the deadliest holiday of all, according to Major Luther C. Moore, commanding the Northwest Region of the Texas Department of Public Safety. "Ironically, Christmas achieves this terrible distinction precisely because we want it to be such a wonderful occasion," Major Moore says. "It is a sentimental holiday. People will drive long distances for the traditional family reunion, undaunted by bad weather and road conditions. More travel -- especially winter travel at highway speeds -- means more accidents," the Major adds. "It would be interesting to discover, in this era of jets and computers, what the word holiday means to most people. What is the first thing that flashes to mind when the word is mentioned? Time off from work? -- A trip? -- An excuse to celebrate? -- Or a tragic accident toll?" Major Moore asks. "Unfortunately, truthful answers probably would place all of those higher on the list than the true meaning of the holiday. And it's especially unfortunate that holidays must have an association with high accident tolls," the Major says. "The joyous spirit of Christmas is too often sought in the liquid form. This deadly combination of the throttle and bottle many times turns rejoicing into deepest sorrow. Last year in Texas 38 percent of all rural fatal accidents involved a drinking driver," warns the Major. Major Moore reported that the four most frequent violations in all rural fatal accidents are: (1) Rural side of road, (2) Driving while drunk, (3) Wrong side of road, and (4) Did not have right-of-way. "We feel it is important to point out these facts as the Christmas holidays approach, in the hope that our fellow citizens will heed them as warning against doing the things that have caused fatal accidents all over the state," Major Moore said.

Farmers Warned To Watch For Greenbugs

The Texas Cooperative Economic Insect report from Texas A & M University highlights insect activity in the form of Greenbugs which are building up in large numbers in small grain areas throughout Texas and are causing some damage in isolated areas of the State.

J. K. Adams, Bailey County Agent said, "I do not think this insect has reached the stage of damage in Bailey County, but could bear watching and may need poisoning in early spring."

In general, there have been no reports of damaging populations of greenbugs in the Panhandle region north of Amarillo.

However, southeast and southwest of Amarillo in Ran-

The 10,000 conservation contracts signed to date covered about 13 million acres in 99 counties served by 94 SCS work units. Of the 10,000 contracts in Texas, 249 of these are in the Blackwater Valley Soil and Water Conservation District, Bailey County, consisting of 113,484 acres averaging 453.8 acres per farm.

Those assisting with writing the contract were Otto D. Fischgrabe, work unit conservationist; Charles Ball, Soil Conservation technician and Joe Krezih, engineer.

A major milestone with far-reaching effects on the agriculture industry of the Great Plains was reached in November, 1967 when the 10,000 Great Plains
