

ourn on July 26, one week from the day this is being written. Legislative decisions are now being made rapidly. Tax reduction egislation was killed for the ses sion when the Senate voted t sustain the President's veto on the second tax bill. Very likely i. 1948 Congress will pass, and the President will approve, a mor equitable tax bill than the one which Congressman Knutson has tried twice to enact into law this year.

It is now a foregone certainty that the Senate will approve the terminal leave bill for enlisted men which we passed in the House sometime ago. This will mean that ex-servicemen carconvert their terminal leave bonds to cash if they desire on or

after September 2, 1947. The Presidential Succession bi has now become the law. It pro vides that Speaker Jce Marlin, Republican, would become Presi dent in the event of the death of resignation of Mr. Truman. I wa surprised to observe on the final roll call on the bill that I was one of only 11 Members of the House voting against the meas ure. I feel that when the people

elect a President of one political Party for a four year term that such Party should remain in power under our system of Government until the next Presidential Election. I agree that it would be all right for a Democratic Speaker to succeed Democratic President or for a Republican Speaker to succeed a Republican President, but not otherwise.

The so-called Stratton bill to admit into the United States from Europe 400,000 displaced persons has been sidetracked for the session. I have all sympathy for the infortunate peoples of foreign ands, but I have resisted action by Congress to admit these 400,000 immigrants. We have enough problems without admitting all hese people, many of whom

ould be malcontents and trouble kers. We have fed them and rotected them abroad, but we hould not be required to share eland with them.

Final action on the Agricultural Appropriations bill will soon be taken. It now appears that ubstantially all AAA payments which were authorized for the 947 crop year will be paid. A faw days ago we had our final

neeting of the session of the Texs Congressional delegation in Washington. Words of admiration and praise were spoken for the late Congressman Mansfield of the Galveston District, who passed away a short time ago. Ju-Mansfield was one of the most amazing men I have ever known Although he was 86 years of age at the time of his death, and had been confined to a wheel chair for about 20 years, he was remarkably effective as a legislator. Everybody liked him and trusted him. Prior to the last election he was Chairman of one of the important Committees of Congress and performed a great national service in that capacity. The Judge was never heard to complain of his handicap and his ever cheerful disposition won him the title of the most beloved man in the House.

Congressman Ewing Thomason of the El Paso District is retiring from Congress next week to become Federal Judge in the Western District of Texas. He is one of the top Texans in Washington and his influence will be greatly missed. Like the late Judge Mansfield, he is one of the favorites of the Texas delegation.







Dr. Cox said definitely that when a feeding formula for infants is used, it should be prescribed by a physician and then prepared with extreme care, especially in regard to cleanliness and refrigeration. Babies should be fed at regular intervals and on a definite schedule. Their stomach and bowels can become easily pset if they are fed haphazardly whenever they happen to be fretful or restless.

The State Health Officer declared that with dysentry, as with many other diseases, the fly is an gent of transmission, and every home should be well screened and free of flies.

"If diarrhea or dysentery develops, consult a physician at once," Dr. Cox advised. "This so called summer complaint can become a very serious menace to your baby's health, if not an actual threat to his life."






