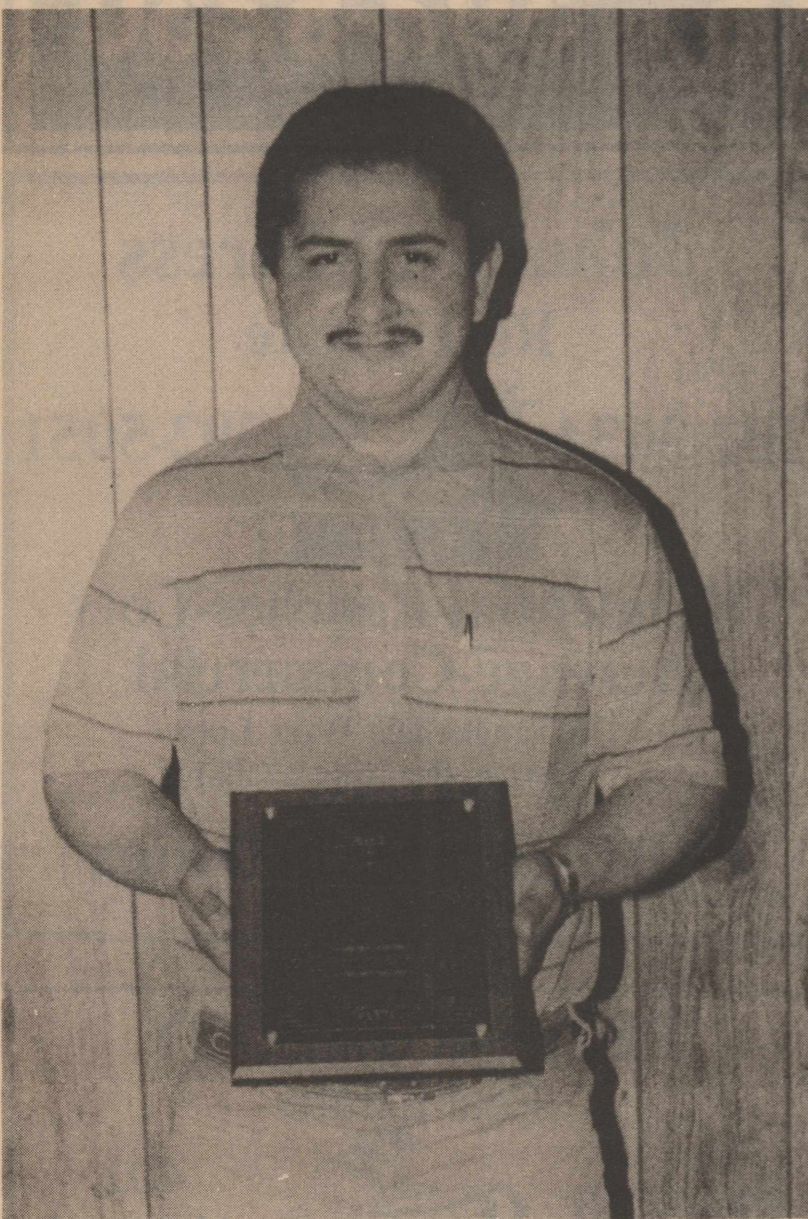

New Priest installed at OLPH

Rev. Alberto M. Tijerina was installed as pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Catholic Church Friday, Jan. 30, by Fr. Joe Uecker, Dean of St. Mary's of San Angelo.

The Odessa native graduated from Ector High School as valedictorian in 1972. He attended seminary at Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio from 1972-76. After graduating with honors in his major of Latin American Studies, Tijerina attended the American College at the Catholic University of Louvain, Belgium.

The University of Louvain was founded in 1425 and is the oldest Catholic University in the world which is still catholic.

Fr. Tijerina earned a bachelor of arts degree in theology in 1978 and a master's in the theology in 1980, graduating with honors.

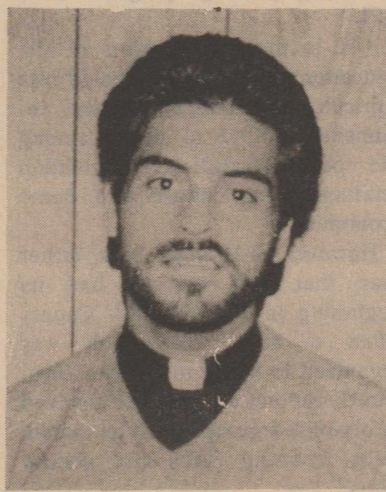
He was ordained Aug. 22, 1980 in his home parish, St. Joseph's Parish of Odessa, by Bishop Joseph Fiorenza of San Angelo. Fiorenza is now bishop of Galveston-Houston.

The first assignment for Fr. Tijerina was Sacred Heart Cathedral Parish in San Angelo. From there he was sent to study church law from 1982-1985.

"I'm looking forward to hard work," said Fr. Tijerina. "I've received a lot of cooperation from people."

Tijerina is the son of the late Alberto Tijerina Sr., a native of Ozona. His mother, Lourdes Mata Tijerina, lives in a convent in Chihuahua, Mexico.

He has three brothers, Reuben Reyes of Santa Fe, NM, Orlando Tijerina of San Angelo and Luis Rey Tijerina of Odessa, and a sister, Belinda Wendt of Odessa.

Georgia woman injured in auto accident

If you must have an accident, Ozona is a good place to do it according to Helena Pitts of Lithonia, GA. Ms. Pitts was injured Jan. 23 when her 1978 Datsun B210 was caught by a cross wind 12.5 miles east of Ozona on I-10.

A friend, Sandra Moore, also of Lithonia, was following Ms. Pitts in a separate vehicle when the accident happened. "The wind caught the car, threw it to the right, she came back onto the highway for a few seconds and then was thrown into the guard rail on the left side of the road," Ms. Moore said.

The driver's side door was against the guard rail, and Ms. Pitts was too injured and pinned in the car to reach the door lock on the other side. "About 10 men lifted my car off

the guard rail so they could get me out," she said. "The people who got me out were really champs."

The two women could not speak highly enough of the local EMS, volunteer fire department and hospital personnel. They expressed amazement that EMS and firemen were all volunteers.

Ms. Pitts was a patient in Crockett County Hospital for several days. She and Ms. Moore spent several days more at Hillcrest Motel waiting for the proper time for stitch removal.

Ms. Pitts received chest and foot injuries and lacerations to the face and leg.

"Everybody here has been really nice," said Ms. Moore of their stay in Ozona.

A look at 4-H membership

There are 305,000 Texas youth between the ages of nine and 19 that are members of the action-oriented, "learning by doing" program called 4-H.

4-H is the youth share of the educational efforts of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, established in 1915 to diffuse among the people practical information relating to agriculture and home economics.

However, 4-H goes back father than that. 4-H actually had its beginning in 1908 in Jack County when a boys' corn club was organized to help grow better corn. Shortly thereafter, girls got involved as organized groups such as tomato clubs, canning clubs and poultry clubs.

4-H in Texas has grown from an organization for farm boys and girls to one that is quite diverse in its makeup. Girls and boys are about equal in number in the program. Current figures show 152,499 girls to 152,533 boys.

About 66 percent of today's 4-H'ers -- 203,447 -- come from towns and cities larger than 50,000 people. More than 33,000 still live on

farms and ranches while more than 46,000 live in small towns and rural non-farm areas. Another 22,000 live in towns and cities with a population of 10,000 to 50,000. Of these 4-H'ers, more than 62,000 are active in 1,887 community 4-H clubs. The remaining 243,000 4-H'ers participate in 4-H through a number of different programs.

Assisting county Extension agents and the Texas 4-H staff to carry out effective learning activities and programs are some 21,000 volunteer leaders. 4-H relies heavily on volunteer leaders to organize 4-H activities and to conduct worthwhile learning experiences for 4-H boys and girls. Volunteer leaders are a vital cog in the total program, from recruitment to providing expertise in teaching various subject areas. Of course, 4-H welcomes any interested individuals to join the volunteer leader ranks.


4-H continues to be a vibrant organization that is leading the way in helping youth to learn practical skills and to gain a knowledge of their environment that will make them better citizens and leaders of tomorrow.

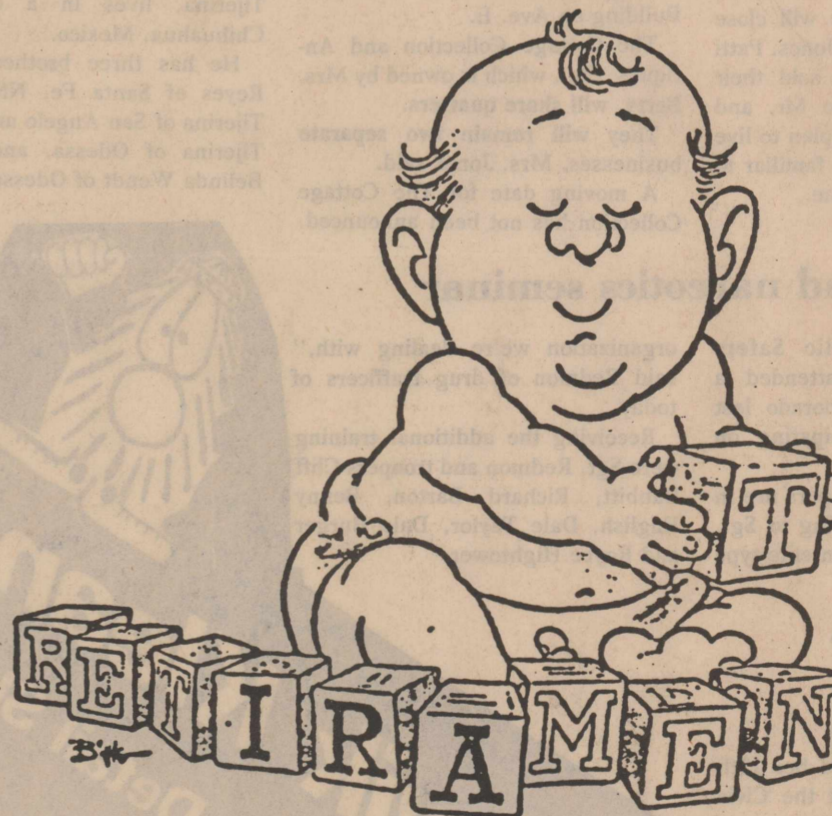
