Pre-K/Kindergarten **Registration Begins**

Pre-Kindergarten to all children handicapped in any way. who will be four years of age on or before September 1, 2006. Pre-Kindergarten will be offered if a sufficient number of four year olds register for the program. With a new 5.99 percent 30-year fixed rate mortgage, West Central Texas RHFC has a \$10 million single family bond program for 2006 that helps borrowers purchase for down payment and closing their first home.

Homebuyers have access to mortgage loans (FHA, VA, RHS and Fannie Mae eligible conventional) that also provide a grant for down payment and closing cost assistance equal to 4 percent of the original loan amount throughout the following counties: Brown, Callahan, Coleman, Comanche, Eastland, Fisher, Haskell, Jones, Kent, Knox, Mitchell, Nolan, Runnels, Scurry, Shackelford, Stephen, Stonewall, Taylor (including the City of Abilene) and Throckmorton.

Income limitations for the program include annual family income not to exceed \$54,300 for families of two or fewer persons and \$62,445 for families of three or more.
