



"Callahan is one of 6 contiguous counties in Texas recently named by the Secretary of Agriculture eligible for loans to cover part of actual production losses resulting from drought on January 1, 2006 and continuing.'

Richard G. Young said, Farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 100% of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue the agricultural business, whichever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest is 3.75 percent.

"As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for a FSA emergency loan," Richard G. Young said. Farmers participating in the Federal Crop Insurance program will have to figure in proceeds open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 from those programs in determining their loss.

thrown it away! It's like that with people. We look at someone, maybe even ourselves, and we see the exterlike much from the outside. It


We see that person as less important than someone more beautiful or stylish or well known with him. As he strolled along or wealthy. But we have not
