ings, some of which he wasn't ings, some of which he wa

He explained that because it was he (as Mayor) that was required oo preside over the meetings, he would very much appreciate it if she would let him know more in advance when another "special" meeting was going to be held. Gosnell apologized and said that
she would do that in the future Moving on, Mayor Purvis said that for months now he had given much thought to the problem with the Senior Citizen's building. He acknowledged that all kinds of deas and suggestions had be mede about the situation. really didn't know what would be the best way to handle this problem. I knew a new roof would be costly and I feared that he City wouldn't be able to afford to replace the roof without some
type of assistance or increase in type of assistance or increase in
City utilities, or property tax."
Purvis then talked about the suggestions some people made about a new building. He said that even though that would be nice, it would be even more costly and leave the same problem of not having any funds. He went on to ay, "After the last meeting, I felt
received some answers." I received some answers."

Mayor Purvis then read Meals On Wheels Volunteer,

Editor' and replied, "After reator and replied, "After the 'Letter To The Editor in last week's paper, I feel that they aren't the only ones that think the Seniors should be left in the current building."
Purvis declared
Purvis declared, "As Mayor. am recommending to the Counci tonight that we forget the idea of a new building and continue to building the Seniorsarecurrently in." He have added that City Employees have worked very hard over the past week to fix the most damaged areas of the roof that are
causing the most problems. He
tated that he had pictures of what had been done and it appears they lave done a great job in correct-
ing the problem. He interiected. "Of course we won't know how good of a job they've done until good of a job they've done until hope the people who are working hard trying to raise funds to help with the repairs can continue looking for these funds." Purvis explained that Julene ranke has written some grants and encouraged others to also
look into what they might do to help with grants. "Now I'm certainly not suggesting that we put all the work on Julene, however if in her experience in writing grants, she wants to continue helping the Senior then I think we should certainly let her look for grants to update the building."
"With the information Kathy Anderson provided us all at the last meeting," Purvis stated, "it is my recommendation that we (the City Council) do not go forward ing, but instead update and upgrade the current building." Mayor Purvis summed up the meeting with, "Therefore, I see no reason in appointing a committee tonight, and I will entertain a motion that we discontinue the idea of building a new Senior Citizens Center and to move forward, allowing Julene
and the Senior Citizens and the Senior citizens the Center and the possibility of getting their 501c3 status." The Council voted unanimously for this decision. The next regular City Council August 13th at 6:30 p.m.
