Tommy Holland, age 73, of Baird, Texas, passed away Friday, August 10, 2007, in Hendrick Hospice in Abilene,





# **Bicycle Safety Tips**

Bicycle riding has been a favorite pastime for more than a century. Unfortunately, it can be a dangerous one. In 2004, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration reported a total of 725 bicycle fatalities nationwide-1.7% of all traffic fatalities and 13% of all nonoccupant traffic fatalities. Texas accounted for 51 of these fatalities.

#### FIVE BASIC RULES TO AVOID INJURIES:

- 1. Never ride out into a street
- without stopping first. 2. Obey stop signs.
- 3. Check behind before swerving, turning or changing
- 4. Never follow another rider without applying the rules.
- 5. Before you get on your

bike, put on a helmet.

Always wear a helmet. It should have a rigid-but crushable-interior material to absorb the force of an impact. A serious fall can cause brain damage or even death.

In three out of every four bicycle crashes, the rider incurs some kind of head injury.

Chose a helmet approved by the Consumer Product Safety Commission.



### · Set your bicycle seat to the proper height. When sitting on the seat with your foot on the pedal, your leg should be slightly bent.

- Ensure you have reflectors on the front and rear of your bike. The rear reflector must be red and at least 3 inches wide.
- When riding at night, the bicycle must have a lamp on the front of the bicycle that emits a white light visible from a distance of a least 500 feet in front of the bicycle.
- · Keep the chain clean and lubricated.
- Check your brakes for even pressure. They should make the back wheels skid on dry pavement and not stick.
- · Make sure the tires are properly inflated. RIDING IN TRAFFIC:
- · Always stop and look for traffic when entering a
- Always stop at stop signs and red lights.
- · Ride with, not against, traffic. Ride on the right as cars
- · Avoid riding at night. The death rate per million trips increases 8 times between 10:00 p.m. and 1:00 a.m.
- · Always look before changing lanes or turning. Use hand signals.
- · Obey all traffic signs and signals. Walk your bike across busy intersections.


# **Howard Fan Revisits Dream Trip**


