





Callahan County, Texas Order Prohibiting Outdoor Burning

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 240.906 of the Local Government Code, the Callahan County Commissioners Court had found that dry conditions in the unincorporated areas of Callahan County created a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burn-conditions, restrictions, and/or charges. ing; and, whereas, such a finding authorizes the issuance of an order which prohibits or restricts outdoor burning.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT OR-DERED that the following regulations are hereby established for all unincorporated areas of Callahan County; Texas.

1) Action prohibited.;

A. A person violates this order if he or she knowingly, intentionally or recklessly burns any combustible material outside of an enclosure which serves to contain all flames and/or sparks, or orders such burning by oth-
