Sheriff asks kids to end chasing games

Donley County Sheriff Butch Blackburn is asking local kids to knock off a game of chase or cat and mouse that has riled some residents.

Blackburn said kids have been chasing each other through people's yards at night and have also sometimes banged on doors and yelled before running off. Some older residents have been scared by the activity, and some kids even got chased by one resident in a vehicle.

"We need to end this before a kid gets run over or, worse, gets shot by someone thinking they have an intruder at their house," the sheriff said.

Burglars run into trouble

Two men were spending time in the Donley County Jail this week after they were caught burglarizing a barn west of Clarendon and became the subjects of a short manhunt.

Sheriff Butch Blackburn said his office was notified of criminal activity at the property about 6:30 a.m. Monday, December 15. When the subjects realized they had been spotted, they drove off through a pasture and through a fence before getting their vehicle wedged in some mesquite trees.

The first subject, 52-year-old Lionel Ray Harris of Amarillo, was picked up near the Clarendon College Livestock & Equine Center, and the second subject, 49-year-old Terry Wayne Cash of Quanah, was captured in an alley on the east side of the city.

Blackburn said city and county workers along with some local firemen helped look for the men before their capture. "We had a lot of help from the community," he said.

Both Cash and Harris have extensive criminal histories, the sheriff said. The men had stolen a John Deere riding lawnmower that morning but ditched it before going across the pasture.

Blackburn reminds everyone to be very aware of their property and possessions right now. Criminal activity is on the rise in terms of burglaries and thefts.

"We usually see this leading up to Christmas and through the holidays, but it seems worse," he said. "These guys were from out of town. Everyone just needs to stay alert and watch out for their neighbors."

City exploring grant funded water project

The City of Clarendon is exploring grant opportunities to fund up to \$3.9 million in water system improvements following last Tuesday's meeting of the Board of Alder-

Grant funding for the project could pay for between 40 and 75 percent of the project, and work could be scaled back depending on the level of grant funds the city qualifies for.

The project, if funded and pursued, would include replacing the standpipe water storage on the east side of town, improving waterlines throughout the city, and installing water meters that can be read electronically, reducing errors and lost work time.

Aldermen last week approved advertising for engineering services on the project, which is the first step in pre-applying for the funds.

After determining what level of grant funds the city qualifies for, officials will determine what size project to pursue and options for funding the city's match.

In other city business, aldermen continued to look at Clarendon's sign ordinance and what changes they would like to make to it. The board will continue to look at this.

Aldermen also reviewed bids for the city's health insurance coverage.

In light of rising premiums and given a bid with better benefits, the board elected to end its FirstCare coverage after nearly two decades and take out coverage through the Texas Municipal League.

In council comments, Alderman Sandy Skelton urged the city to expedite removal of the non-operational elevator on the front of City Hall, and Mayor Larry Hicks said he would see that was done. Workers have since removed the elevator.

There is a growing body of evidence that bigger government means slower growth of real GDP. Once the level of total government spending as a percentage of GDP reaches a tipping point, estimated to be from 15 percent to 25 percent of GDP, additional expansion crowds out private productive investment and slows economic growth. When government overreaches, economic freedom is diminished and private exchange opportunities are lost — that is, the range of choices open to individuals is restricted.

In a pioneering study of the link between the growth of government and the wealth of nations, which appeared in the fall 1998 issue of the Cato Journal, economists James Gwartney, Randall Holcombe, and Robert Lawson found that a 10 percentage point increase in government spending as a percentage of GDP decreases real GDP growth by 1 percentage point. Thus, if government spending went from 25 percent of GDP to 35 percent, real GDP growth would slow over the longer term by a full percentage point. They also found that a 10 percentage point increase in the government's share of GDP lowered private investment by 1.6 percentage points.

One of the key findings of their study was that secure property rights — which includes a legal system that protects persons and property, enforces contracts, and limits the power of government by a just rule of law - play an important role in promoting economic growth.

The positive relationship between property rights and economic growth was developed more fully by the late Bernhard Heitger, an economist at the Kiel Institute for World Economics, in his path-breaking article in the winter 2004 Cato Journal. In that article, Heitger distinguished between proximate and ultimate determinants of economic growth. The former are well known: additions to physical and human capital and technological progress (also known as total factor productivity). But Heitger was interested in the question of what drives capital accumulation and innovation. His answer: the structure of property rights and the associated incentives.

Today, the size and scope of government in the United States would be beyond the imagination of America's Founding Fathers. For more than a century after the ratification of the Constitution and Bill of Rights, limits on government power were taken seriously. At the start of the 20th century, total government spending was less than 10 percent of GDP, with the majority of spending taking place at the state and local levels. In 1900, federal spending was a mere 2.8 percent of GDP compared to 21.1 percent in 2014. Meanwhile, state and local spending stood at 5 percent of GDP in 1900, but reached 11.5 percent in 2014. Overall government spending now stands at nearly 33 percent of GDP (see www.downsizinggovernment.

That tectonic shift is largely due to the growth of entitlements and the regulatory state. Nearly half of federal spending goes toward Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid; huge regulatory costs are imposed on the private sector; and the higher taxes needed to finance big government erode economic incentives to work, save, and invest.

The loss of economic freedom in the United States is revealed in the annual Economic Freedom of the Word Report, published by the Fraser Institute along with the Cato Institute and a number of global think tanks. In 2000, the United States was the second most economically free country in the world, based on data from 1998. Today it is ranked 12th, based on 2012 data.

To move up the freedom ladder, the United States needs to change the climate of ideas and recognize the importance of private property rights and the rule of law. A legal framework that safeguards persons and property means incentivizing individuals to take responsibility for their actions and allowing people to learn from their mistakes. It means cutting back the size and scope of government and not bailing out businesses.

The nature of government is coercion; the nature of the market is consent. The "great constitutional charter" that George Washington referred to in his First Inaugural Address (April 30, 1789) was intended to bind Congress to the powers enumerated in Article 1, Section 8 of the Constitution. Thomas Jefferson reiterated Washington's admonition by stating in his Frist Inaugural Address (March 4, 1801): "The sum of good government" is "a wise and frugal Government, which shall restrain men from injuring one another, shall leave them otherwise free to regulate their own pursuits of industry and improvement, and shall not take from the mouth of labor the bread it has earned."

The challenge for the 114th Congress is to return to "a wise and frugal government." A first step would be to understand the detrimental effects of expanding government power on economic liberties - especially on private property rights. If history has taught us anything, it is that the size and scope of government matters, both for freedom and prosperity.

TSCRA prepares for legislative session

On January 13, 2015, the 84th session of the Texas Legislature is kicking off in Austin, Texas. The state House and Senate are welcoming back many seasoned legislators, but also adding many freshmen to the halls of the Capitol. We will do everything possible to make sure cattle raisers and landowners have the best outcome at the end of this session, and your help is always welcome.

In the past TSCRA members have been instrumental in making us aware of critical issues and providing a strong voice over at the Capitol. In fact, last session it was TSCRA members who

made hundreds of phone calls opposing legislation that would have made it easier for oil and gas pipeline companies to condemn land while limiting the rights of landowners. We will need this same amount of

New Drug Approved to Treat Type of MS

Alemtuzumab (Lemtrada) has been approved by the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to help treat relapsing forms of multiple sclerosis (MS), or those who have not had an improvement with two or more therapies in the past. The FDA requires that the label have a boxed warning of increased risk for certain malignancies and certain autoimmune disorders. A restricted distribution program is a part of the FDA's Risk and Evaluation and Mitigation Strategy (REMS). REMS requires that healthcare providers and patients be aware of the serious risks and regular monitoring necessary to prevent any concerning side effects. Lemtrada is approved to be given into the veins as an infusion for five days, then for three days twelve months later.

MS is a condition where the body attacks the soft covering around the nerves. The covering is called myelin and it is important to send signals from the brain and spinal cord. In MS communication among the nerves is not coordinated properly causing different severities of potential damage. Symptoms include numbness or tingling in parts of the body, double vision, slurred speech and difficulty walking.
