To rely entirely upon reports of individual growers, or their neighbors, is to be misled. Not all men can tell the size of their own fields, much less the extent of ground tilled on the other side of their fences.

The best that can be done, howver, has been done by the Crony maintain gates and pay him \$100 and we estimate the total acreage damages. 
