TREATY SIGNED REGULATING USE OF RIO GRANDE WATERS.

Washington, May 21.-Secretary Root, for the United States and Ambassador Casasus, for the Mexican Government, today signed a treaty regulating the use of the waters of the Rio Grande, which, if approved by the Senate. will remove what has for twenty years been a source of friction in the relations of the two countries. For almost a century the Mexicans living along the lower river have made large use of its waters for the purpose of irrigating their lands. But in recent years private companies on the upper waters of the United States have, by the construction of dams, diverted a large part of the water to this side of the river.

The Mexicans have preferred claims for the damages sustained, but so far without success. Now the plans for the reclamation have made it certain that practically all of the water will be retained on American soil unless some proper scheme of division can be arranged.

The construction of the \$7,000, 000 dam across the Rio Grande at Engle, N. M., brought the matter to a climax and led to negotiations between the two countries which culminated in the treaty signed today.

The underlying principle of the convention is the recognition of the common law right of the Mexicans to the use of a fair share of the waters of the river, but as the United States Governent is put to the entire expense

of building the great dam and canals the Mexican share is only a fractional portion of the whole flow. It is estimated that the impounded waters will suffice to irrigate about 200,000 acres of otherwise arid lands, and it is stipulated that of this total 60,000 acres of water, which is to make arable about 25,000 acres of the land, will be delivered on the Mexican side of the border each year. On its part the Mexican Government guarantees the United States Government against any suits or liability on account of the claims of individual Mexicans who have so far suffered through the division of the

Opposition to the treaty is expected on the part of some of the Western Senators, who express the belief that either the United States is entitled to all of the water without compensation in view of the great expenses to which it has been put by the work of constructing the dam and canals, or that if the Mexican right is to be recognized at all its title should be purchased outright by a cash payment.

TREATY SIGNED REGULATING USE OF RIO GRANDE WATERS. 2

Washington, May 21.-Secretary Root, for the United States and Ambassador Casasus, for the Mexican Government, today signed a treaty regulating the use of the waters of the Rio Grande, which, if approved by the Senate, will remove what has for twenty years been a source of friction in the relations of the two countries. For almost a century the Mexicans living along the lower river have made large use of its waters for the purpose of irrigating their lands. But in recent years private companies on the upper waters of the United States have, by the construction of dams, diverted a large part of the water to this side of the river.

The Mexicans have preferred claims for the damages sustained, but so far without success. Now the plans for the reclamation have made it certain that practically all of the water will be retained on American soil unless some ******************** proper scheme of division can be arranged.

The construction of the \$7,000, 000 dam across the Rio Grande at Engle, N. M., brought the matser to a climax and led to negotiations between the two countries which culminated in the treaty signed today.

The underlying principle of the convention is the recognition of the common law right of the Mexicans to the use of a fair share of the waters of the river, but as the United States Govern-

pent is put to the entire expense of building the great dam and canals the Mexican share is only a fractional portion of the whole flow. It is estimated that the impounded waters will suffice to irrigate about 200,000 acres of otherwise arid lands, and it is stipulated that of this total 60,000 acres of water, which is to make arable about 25,000 acres of the land, will be delivered on the Mexican side of the border each year. On its part the Mexican Government guarantees the United States Government against any suits or liability on account of the claims of individual Mexicans who have so far suffered through the division of the

Opposition to the treaty is expected on the part of some of the Western Senators, who express the belief that either the United States is entitled to all of the water without compensation in view of the great expenses to which it has been put by the work of constructing the dam and canals, or that if the Mexican right is to be recognized at all its title should be purchased outright by a cash payment.
