



#### **Plant Laboratory** For South Texas.

We have taken orders Arrangements Will Not Be Perfected Until Appropriation is Assured.

Hon. Jno. N. Garner, representative of this Congressional That's why we get district is in receipt of a letter from R. V. Gallaway, chief of Bureau of Plant Industry at Washington, relative to the proposed laboratory for South Texas: The letter reads as follows:

"In reply to your request for information as to our plans for the establishment of a plant laboratory for South Texas, I may say that we have not yet fully perfected arrangements and canthere will be an appropriation for the purpose. As you know, the outlook for the appropriation is very encouraging and so far as think there need be any apprehen-

From all the evidence we have been able to gather, the laboratory should be established at some point close to Brownsville where mental work and where there will be the necessary facilities in connection with investigations

It might be well at this time to shops of this plant. briefly outline what the scope of the work at such a laboratory will in is a specialist in be. We have a similar branch of one at St. Louis, known as the Mississippi Valley Laboratory, and we have had one in Southern olens is the finest Texas, as we now see it, would establish itself under the following

> 1. Studies of the diseases of plants. The successful cultivation of crops in this entire region will be dependent upon a thor-ough knowledge of many obscure seases which prevail there. Those who have visited the section report peculiar diseases affecting many plants, especially trees and shrubs. Figs, oranges, and similar plants are troubled with a number of maladies that will have to be studied in order that in the introduction work, which will be specified later, difficulties will not be met with.

2. Testing and propagating new and rare plants and the building up of new industries connected therewith. This is one of the most important features of the work and would have for its object the bringing together and testing of rare plants and seeds from all over the world, with view to determining their success in this section and the building up of industries as the result of such work. Fig. date, mango, orange, and many other tropical and semitropical plants would have to be thoroughly tested in this way. Whenever a plant is found to be valuable and promising it will be propagated and distributed.

In this connection it is well to understand that the Department does not have any of these things at present to distribute from Washington. In fact, experience has shown that distribution of this kind is of little value. These new plants must first be thoroughly tested under experienced horticulturists, because, if placed in the hands of men not familiar with them they are apt to be lost and the results disappointing.

3. The laboratory can be used for the working out of many problems having a much broader application than south Texas,problems, connected with the improvement of seed, plant breeding problems, etc. Altogether, we look upon the field as very promising and as offering a region heretofore but little explored so far as plant growth is concerned.
