SEPTEMBER RAINFALL **HEAVIEST THIS YEAR.**

PRECIPITATION NEARLY SEVEN INCHES AT COTULLA.

Eclipses Any Record of Previous

Years-Splendid Season in Ground.

month amounted to 6.80 inches, which is the greatest precipitation for any month this year, and breaks the record for the month

The rain was distributed as follows: 4th, 3.50; 5th, .15; 12th, .64; 18th, .25; 19th, 2.00 23rd, .31.

The season in the ground is better than for years. In fact the oldest settlers do not recall a time when the ground was as thoroughly soaked in the month of September as it is now. Everywhere the ground is covered!

with grass which keeps the water from running off, and it goes into the ground instead of in the creeks. With the immense amount of water that has fallen the river has hardly overflowed its banks except in low places, but it has been swimming for a month.
