Rockwell, irrigation expert of the Department of Agriculture, who has been here during the past two months helping all farmers who desire his aid in the establishment and conduct of irrigation plants. The department has detailed Mr. Rockwell to this territory to assis. in an advisory way with the irrigation propositions, and several farmers have availed themselves of his assistance.

A resolution will be presented at the meeting of Business Men's Club directors Friday commending the work of Mr. Rockwell and asking the department to make his assignment here permanent, with headquarters in San Antonio. The business men recognize that such work as is being done by Mr. Rockwell is almost priceless in etablishing the new order of things, and he fit so well into the situation that his permanent retention is earnestly desired. Quarters for Mr. Rockwell have been established at the Business Men's Club, and he is accessible there to any man who has an irrigation project. Hie vervices are available in an advisory capacity for anyone who needs to learn about irrigation.


