"Wonderful!" is the way Capt. Horeywell expressed it, adding that he believed Southwest Texas had the finest climate on earth. Captain Honeywell has won internatioval fame as a baloonist and in Germany last September made an excellent record as a representative of the United

that he made a number of flights that he made a number of flights
from San Antonio in 1911, and in April of the same year endeav ored to establish a long distance record, but encountered a bad storm and was forced to come to the earth near Little Rock. Captain Honewell has made 177 flights during his career as a pilot, and his best record for distance was made in the Inter nayonal cost year at ang Cermany last year.
