Action Opens Way for Law to Pre-vent Shipments to Dealers in Prohibition Territory.

COX been dealt a body blow by Congress If legislation favorably passed upon is enacted into law, as now seems most probable, the national impediment to the enforcement of State liquor regulations will be removed. Interstate shipment of intoxicating liquors with intent to violate the laws of a state will be prohibited

by national statute.

By an overwhelming majority the House passed the Webb liquor bill, which promises to provide the first real protection the national government has ever given the prohibition states against the interstate traffic Cotulla, : : : Texas of liquor. The Webb bill and the Kenyon bill in the Senate are similar in important provisions, forbidding the shipment of liquor to dealers in any dry state and giving the authorities the right to investigate the intent of the shipper of every consignment of liquor into a prohibition state. The Webb bill is as drastic as it could be made with-




