ANTONIO GARZA KILLED AT MILLETT.

Struck on Head With Mescal Bottle While Trying to Put Disturbers out of Pool Room.

Antonio Garza, a saloon man of Cotulla, had his skull broken by being hit with a bottle last Saturday night in a pool room at Millett, and died from the injuries Thursday morning without gaining consciousness.

Garza went to Millett on the midnight train and went up to a pool hall which was operated by his nephew. There he found two Mexicans, Dick and Ramon Gomez making a rough house, and Garza attempted to put them out. He and Dick Gomez was clinched in a scuffle, and it is alleged that Ramon Gomez threw a mezal bottle at Garza, the bottom of it striking him just above the eyes. The blow crushed his skull and he fell senseless. He was moved to his brother's home and a physician summoned. The doctor removed several pieces of skull. Garza never regained consciousness and died Thursday morning.

Dick Gomez is now in jail here but his brother, Ramon, made a get-a-way and has not yet been apprehended.







RAILROAD RATES

COMMISSIONS HAVE POWER TO DECIDE CHARGES.

Supreme Court of United States Hands Down Decision in Minnesota Case.

Washington, D. C., June 17.—Stat control of railroads under existing law was emphatically affirmed by th United States supreme court thi week in a unanimous decision hander down in what is popularly known a the Minnesota rate case.

The decision is of momentous in portance to the country, rivaling it its effect those rendered in the Stand ard Oil and tobacco trust cases.

It sustains the power of State Leg islatures and State Railroad Commis sions—in the absence of conflicting national legislation—to fix 2 cent of other rates on business exclusively within the State, provided such rate are not confiscatory and even though such rates incidentally affect the in terstate commerce.

It makes the railroads subject to the control of forty-eight state com-missions and legislatures, as well as to the interstate commerce commis

It is a sweeping victory for the state's rights doctrine in the matter of fixing maximum freight and pas senger charges. Ever since the fed eral rate regulation act of 1906 known as the Hepburn-Dolliver act went into effect, controversy has rag-ed over the question whether regulation of intra-state rates by the state was not an interference with interstate commerce, control of which the Constitution vests in Congress. It has been far the most important issue raised since the general subject of rate regulation assumed the status which the act of 1906 gave it.




