El Paso Canal Pronounced Impractical.

El Paso, Tex., March 5-The proposition for a high line canal to bring water from El Paso from the Elephant-Butte Dam was abonded today at a joint conference of G. A "ant engineers and land owners who are to utilize the wat pecause of its heavy cost which would have been \$1,300,000.

The original intention had been to utilize the water also for generating power and to get back much of the cost by the sale of the power, but owing to the fact that the canal would only be running at certain seasons of the year it was considered that the power plant would not be continuous and therefore not effective.

The engineers also decided it would be best to bring the water down the river from the dam otherwise the present river might grow up in weeds and in the event of a flood that would overflow the dam or heavy local rains much country might be damaged by changing the course of the river or overflowing adjacent country.

The letter demanding the money was dated March. 3 and not paid in five days, Luis would Villa. This threat General Terrazas construed to mean that his son would fall a victim to the notorious fugitive law if the money is not forthcoming. Under the provisions of "ley fuga" the prisoner is always shot "while trying to escape."





Public schools will soon close. Teachers have an average of about six months on the pay roll t perhaps an average salary of 60 per month, netting then \$360 for the year, or an equival ent of \$30 per month for the year. In other words, the educated teacher's salary for the ear is less than that of the unducated day laborer.

The President of the Texas ate Teachers Association made e statement a couple of years go, before the State Convention, hat 6000 teachers quit the profession in Texas annually. Can you blame them, when you compare their annual earning capac ity with that of any other class of educated men and women. The bookkeeper, or stenographer or operator gets, as a beginner, from \$60 to \$100 per month twelve months in the year, and soon receive an advance in salary and it isn't long before they are promoted to assistant managers or managers of large business concerns where they draw a salary of from \$2000 to \$5000 per




