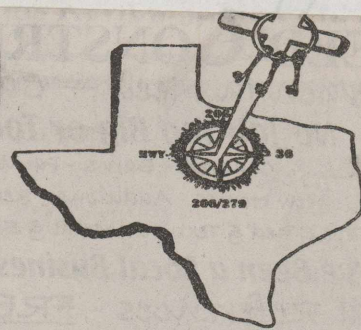

Longevity pay only given to County paid employees

Callahan County Commissioners voted to give longevity pay only to county employees during the commissioners' court meeting held Monday, December 29th in the commissioners' courtroom at the Callahan County Courthouse in Baird.

County commissioners discussed longevity pay and the eligibility of state paid employees. The longevity pay discussion centered around one state paid employee.

After the discussion, Commissioner Harold Hicks made a motion to not pay state paid employees longevity pay—that only county employees are eligible for longevity pay. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Cliff Kirkham and was approved with a unanimous 5-0 vote.

Other agenda items brought before the commissioners' court meeting included:

—The commissioners' court meeting was called to order at 1:05 p.m. by Judge Roger Corn. Present were Commissioner Precinct #1 Harold Hicks, Commissioner Precinct #2 Bryan Farmer, Commissioner Precinct #3 Tom Windham, Commissioner Precinct #4 Cliff Kirkham, County Treasurer Dianne Gunter, and County Clerk Donna Bell. Also present at the meeting was County Attorney Shane Deel.

—The minutes of the previous commissioners' court meeting were reviewed and signed.

—County Extension Agent Hoss Sasin presented his 2008

Annual Report to the commissioners court. Sasin also gave commissioners an update on the proposed Feral Hog Hunt on Monday, January 8th and Tuesday, January 9th.

Sasin presented the commissioners' court with a year end summary of Extension sponsored events in 2008.

Some of the planned events scheduled by the Extension Agent's office in 2009 include:

Commissioner Farmer made a motion to approve the 2008 Annual Extension Agent's Report. Commissioner Windham seconded the motion and it was approved with a 5-0 vote.

—County Treasurer Dianne Gunter presented to the court for its approval, the Official Bonds and Oaths for newly elected and reelected county officials. On a motion by Commissioner Farmer and a second by Commissioner Windham, the commissioners' court voted 5-0 to approve the Official Bonds

and Oaths for newly elected and reelected officials.

—Sheriff Eddie Curtis came before the commissioners' court to discuss the possibility of him and his deputies purchasing their county-issued weapons. Curtis and his deputies are all issued SigSauer handguns, which are purchased by the county.

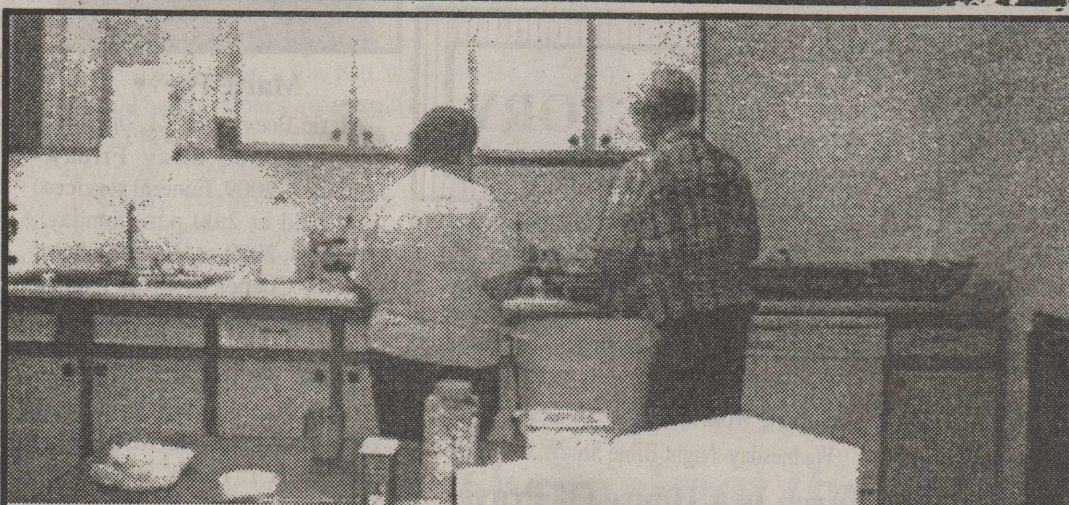
Judge Corn had discussed this item with a representative of the Texas Association of Counties and the Sheriff's Association and neither organization knew of this taking place in any other county in the state.

County Attorney Shane Deel read from the Local Government Code Chapter 263, 152 on the disposition or selling of the county's surplus property.

After further discussion, Judge Corn made a motion to table any action of selling or awarding county-issued weapons until further research has been made. Commissioner Kirkham seconded the motion and the motion was approved with a 5-0 vote.

—Commissioner Farmer made a motion to pay the approved bills, with the exception of one bill. Commissioner Windham seconded the motion, which passed with a unanimous 5-0 vote.

—A motion was made by Commissioner Hicks and seconded by Commissioner Farmer to adjourn the commissioners' court meeting at 1:45 p.m. The motion was approved with a 5-0 vote.

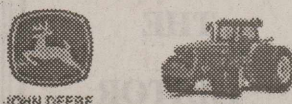

Museum Visitors Continue Throughout the Holidays

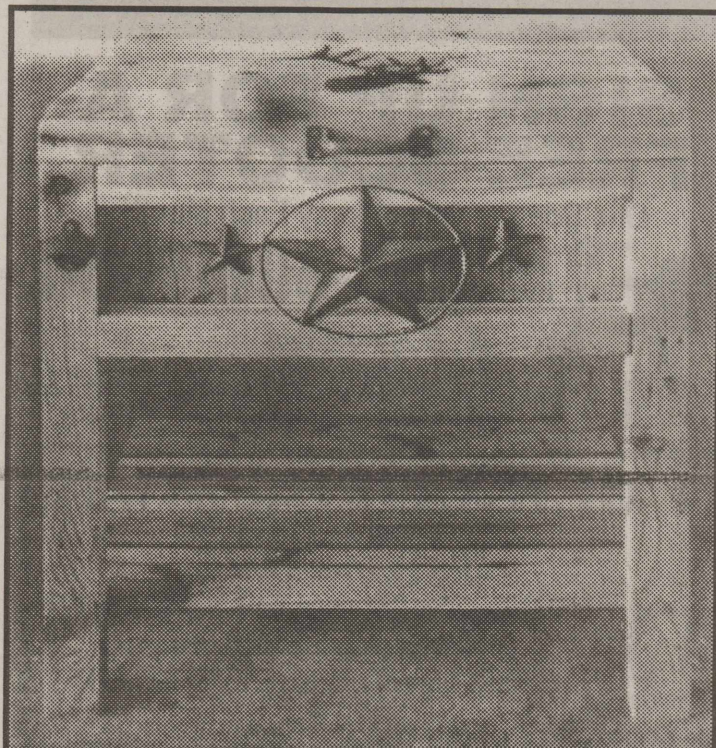

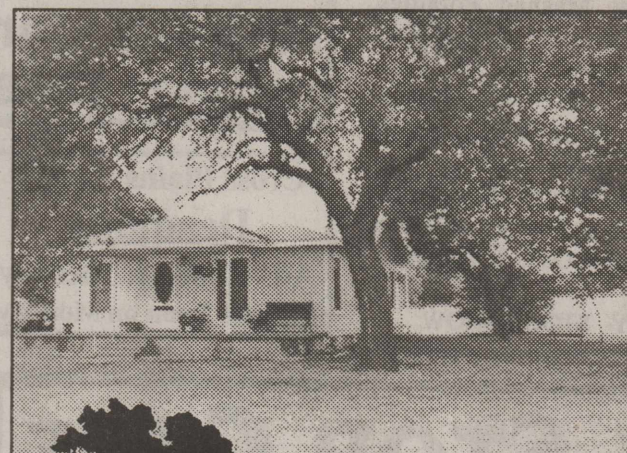

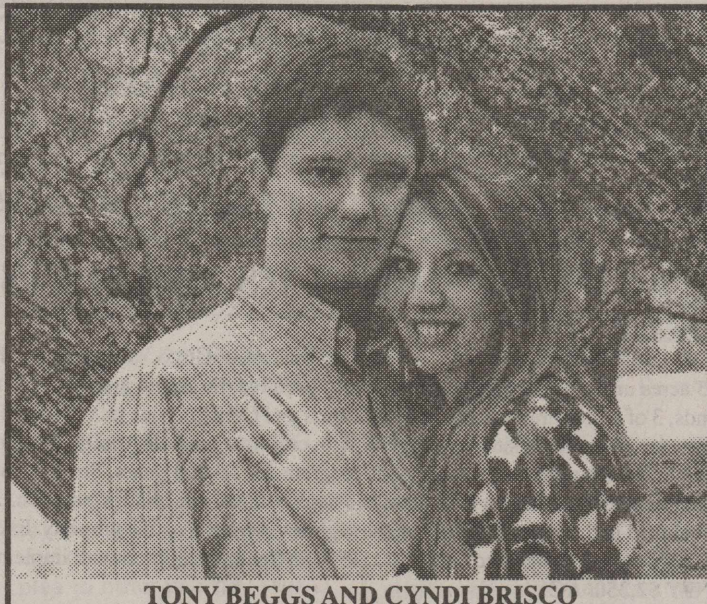
