up deadline from June 1st, to Aug. 14, 2009, for both the Direct and Counter-cyclical
Program (DCP) and the forthcoming Average Crop
Revenue Election (ACRE) Program. This action extends the sign-up deadline by 10
weeks to give producers ample weeks to give producers ample
time to decide whether to participate in ACRE or remain
in DCP. in DCP.
"Extending the sign-up
deadline for both these programs ensure that America's farmers have enough information and time
needed to determine if ACRE is the right program for their operational needs," said Frost. The DCP and ACRE programs play a critical role in the farm
safety net and it is vital that we safety net and it is vital that we
act to support the hard work of the farmers we depend on." Sign-up for ACRE is expected to start in late April, with an to bicial sign-up announcement
to made in the coming weeks. Producers can elect ACRE at their FSA county office after the sign-up period
commences. The original commences. The original
June 1 st deadline may have forced producers to rush their decision, which is why this extension gives producers
more time to make an more time to make an
informed decision about infarmed decis for about
staying with DCP for 2009 or staying with DCP for year 2009 and beyond through
2012 . The ACRE program,
authorized by the 2008 Farm Bill, provides eligible producers a state-level revenue
guarantee, based on the 5guarantee, based on the 5 -
year state Olympic average year state Olympic average
yield and the 2 -year national average price. ACRE payments are made when both state and farm-level triggers
are met. By participating in are met. By participating in
ACRE, producers elect to forgo counter-cyclical payments, receive a 20 -percent reduction
in direct payments and a 30 in direct payments and a 30 -
percent reduction in loan rates. percent reduction in loan rates.
The decision to elect ACRE binds the farm to the program through the 2012 crop year, the last crop
