## Postal Cancellation Featured Friday During Howard Days

In addition to all the tours, panel discussions, swap meets, book signings, silent auction and celebration dinner planned as part of the annual Robert E. Howard Days, a special one day postal cancellation will be available at the Cross Plains Post Office on Friday, June 12 from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. The Post Office will have plenty of stamped postcards; stamped envelopes, long and short; postcard stamps; and a variety of regular stamps. The Post Office invites everyone to come by Friday to receive your special cancellation.

Bill Cavalier of Michigan City, IN created the cancellation design, featuring a likeness of Robert Howard standing amongst the ruins of Ft. McKavett down southeast of San Angelo. Cavalier, an artist by trade, has been a regular attendee at the Howard Days since they were organized in 1986.

The Howard Days celebration is the result of a combined effort of the local Project Pride organization, the Robert E. Howard United Press Association and the Robert E. Howard Foundation. The REHUPA organizes the programs, promotes the event on-line and rounds up

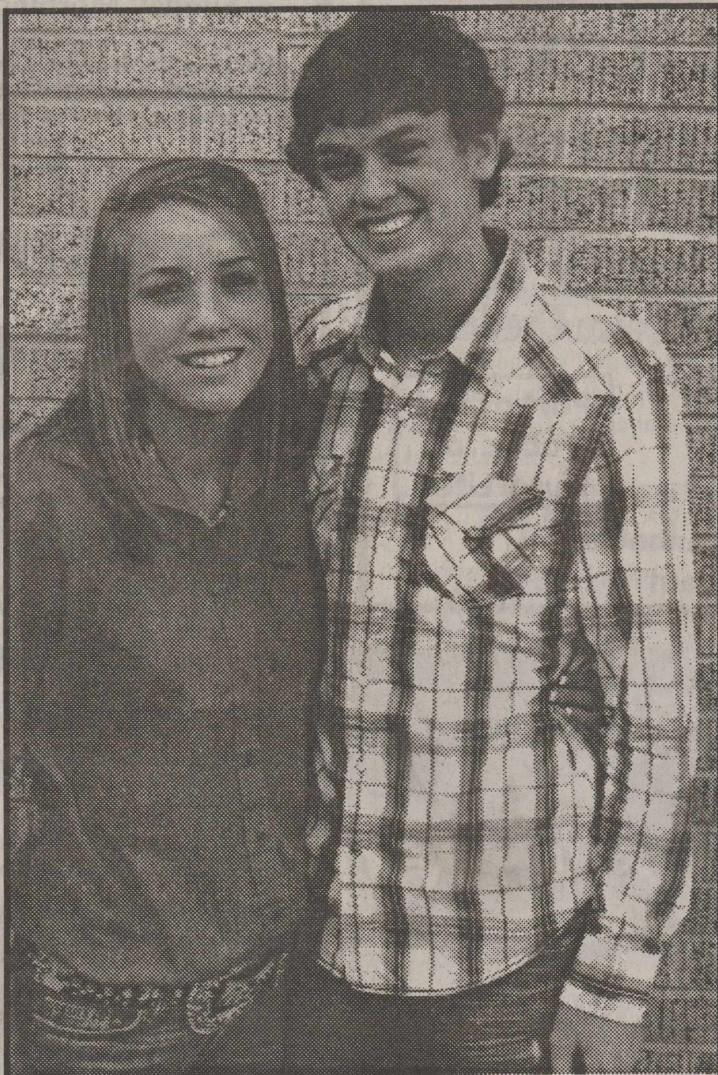

A memorial service is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. Saturday, June 13, 2009 at the Cottonwood Baptist Church in Cottonwood with Matt McGowen officiating; internment will follow in the Cottonwood Cemetery.

Our beloved mother Jane Muelberger Purvis passed away in Austin on April 22, 2009. A former resident of Cottonwood, she moved to Wimberly, Texas in 1998 after the death of her husband John Purvis in 1996. Janet was born in Hoboken, New Jersey, on June 26, 1918, and graduated from Columbia Presbyterian School of Nursing in 1940.

She served as an army nurse in World War II, where she met her husband John. They married in Baltimore, Maryland in 1944, and both served in Europe. After the war, Janet and John moved to Cottonwood to the Purvis homestead where they reared five children.

Janet worked for several years as the RN for Dr. Carl Sohns in Cross Plains. She left that position to teach nursing at Hendricks Memorial Hospital in Abilene, and she ended her nursing career as Director of Nursing at El Graham Hospital in Cisco.

After retirement, Janet continued to be active in the Cottonwood Baptist Church where she was a member for more than 50 years. She stayed

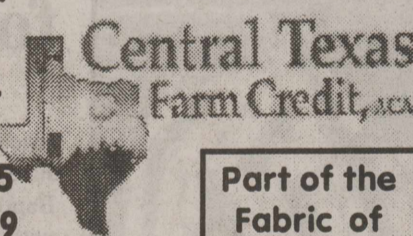

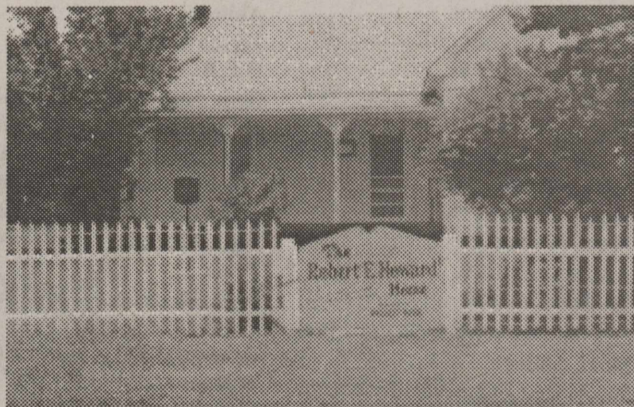
## Annual Quilt Drawing

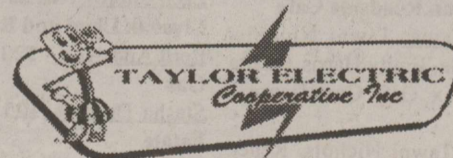
## Bicycle Tour this Saturday Morning

### NIPPER'S MASTER'S VOICE

During the mid-twentieth century, one of the most recognizable brand icons in America was a dog sitting in front of an old-time gramophone, head cocked, listening to the sound. That iconic image, owned by RCA Victor record company, was taken from a painting by English artist Francis Barraud. The dog, Nipper, had been owned by Barraud's brother who had recorded his voice on early phonograph records. After the brother died, Barraud inherited Nipper, the gramophone and records. Whenever the records with Nipper's master's voice were played, the dog would sit in front of the gramophone listening to his master's voice.

That's a beautiful image of the relationship between Jesus Christ and us. He has gone away from earth, so we can no longer hear his physical voice. But we sit in front of His Word and listen to our Master's teachings.

Listening for the Master's voice is a sign of loyalty and longing - an indication that we are eager to hear and obey.

# New School Immunization Requirements Effective August 1st

Changes to school immunization requirements for five vaccines take effect August 1st according to Texas Department of State Health Services officials.

"The changes were made to update the Texas elementary and secondary school immunization requirements to more closely match recommendations by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices," said Jack Sims, DSHS immunization branch manager.

Changes affect mainly students entering kindergarten and seventh grade. All immunizations must be completed by the first day of attendance at public and private schools. The vaccines and new requirements are:

- Hepatitis A vaccine:** Students entering kindergarten statewide must have had two doses of the hepatitis A vaccine.

- Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) vaccine:** Students entering kindergarten must have had two doses of the MMR vaccine. Students in grades 1 through 12 must continue to meet the current requirement, which is two doses of a measles-containing vaccine and one dose each of mumps and rubella vaccine.

- Varicella vaccine:** Students entering kindergarten and seventh grade must have had two

doses. Students in grades 1 through 6 and 8 through 12 must continue to meet the current requirement, which is one dose of varicella vaccine.

- Tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis-containing vaccine (Tdap):** Students entering seventh grade must have had one dose of Tdap vaccine. Students in seventh grade must have had a booster dose of Tdap, but only if it has been five years since their last dose of a tetanus-containing vaccine. Students in grades 8 through 12 must have had a booster dose of Tdap if it has been 10 years since their last dose of a tetanus-containing vaccine.

- Meningococcal vaccine:** Students entering seventh grade must have had one dose.

"A student may be enrolled provisionally if the student has received at least one dose of each required vaccine," Sims

said. "To remain enrolled, the student must complete the required doses in each vaccine series on schedule and as quickly as is medically feasible."

Information about the new Texas immunization requirements was sent to health care providers, schools and child-care facilities earlier this year.

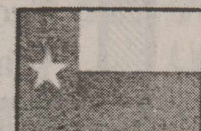

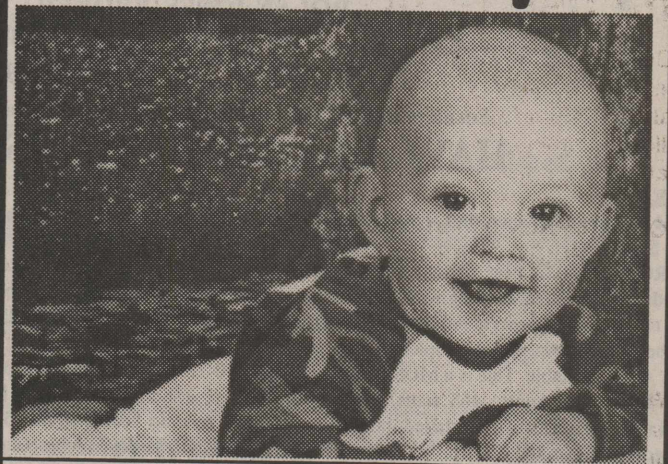

## Commissioners approve order prohibiting the use of fireworks in Callahan County

On the 5th day of June, 2009, the Commissioners' Court of Callahan County adopted the following order effective immediately:

### ORDER PROHIBITING USE OF FIREWORKS IN UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF CALLAHAN COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court has determined that during the July 4th fireworks season, the rural acreage in the county not under cultivation for

a period of at least twelve months are determined to be extremely hazardous for the danger of fire because of high grass and dry vegetation and allows the Commissioners' Court of a county to prohibit the sale or use of restricted fireworks in specific areas in Callahan County; and

WHEREAS, on the 5th day of June, 2009, the Commissioners' Court of Callahan County has determined that the normal danger of fire in the unincorporated areas of Callahan County is greatly enhanced by the ex-

remely dry conditions now existing.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commissioners' Court of Callahan County adopts this Order prohibiting the use of restricted fireworks in the unincorporated areas of Callahan County.

A. No persons may detonate, ignite, or in any way use fireworks classified under 49 C.F.R. part 173.100(r)(2) (10-1-86 edition), as "skyrockets with sticks", and "Missiles with fins" in any portion of the unincorporated area of Callahan County.

B. This Order does not prohibit:

1. Common fireworks, small in size classified as Class C explosives.

2. Large fireworks devices designed primarily to produce visible or audible effects by combustion, deflagration, or detonation and classified as Class B explosive by the U.S. Dept. of Transportation (TEX. OCC. CODE, Chapter 2154).

3. The sale of "skyrockets with sticks" and "missiles with fins."

C. A person commits an offense if the person knowingly or intentionally violates a prohibition established by this Order. An offense under this order is a Class C Misdemeanor.

## Order prohibiting certain fireworks in unincorporated areas of Callahan County

Callahan County officials approved an order prohibiting the use of fireworks in unincorporated areas of Callahan County.

At the June 5th county commissioners' meeting, Commissioner Harold Hicks made a motion to approve an Order Prohibiting Certain Fireworks in Unincorporated Areas of Callahan County. Commissioner Cliff Kirkham seconded and the motion passed with a 5-0 vote.

The order follows:

### ORDER PROHIBITING CERTAIN FIREWORKS IN UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF CALLAHAN COUNTY, TEXAS

A. A person commits an offense if he or she intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly detonates, ignites, or in any way uses fireworks on a county road or in the right-of-way of a county road.

B. If the landowners' permission is obtained prior thereto, persons may detonate, ignite, or use fireworks on private property in unincorporated areas of the county, as long as:

1. The person using the fire-

## Commissioners approve bid of \$342,633 to repair County Roads

The Callahan County Commissioners awarded bids in the amount of \$342,633 for County Road disaster repair to Raydon, Inc.

The commissioners' court took the action Friday, June 5th during a regular meeting held at the Callahan County Courthouse in Baird.

On a motion by Commissioner Tom Windham and a second by Commissioner Harold Hicks, the commissioners' court voted 5-0 to approve the recommendation of Johnny Tabor with Tabor Engineering to go with Option #2 and award the bid for road disaster repair to Raydon, Inc. contingent on approval from the Office of Rural Community Affairs and Grantwork's approval and to allow County Judge Roger Corn to sign for the commissioners' court on the award.

Raydon, Inc. is headquartered in Breckenridge. The company is constructing the First United Methodist Church Fellowship Hall in Clyde, and is a subcontractor on the new Clyde Elementary School building now under construction.

The \$350,000 grant from ORCA was for flooding which occurred in March 2008.

Judge Corn said the grant amount will be lower than the \$342,633 of the bid because the engineering costs associated with the project, as well as Grantwork's fee is included in the total \$350,000 grant. The road work is located in County Precinct #3 and County Precinct #4.

The County Roads approved in the bid for repair include:

County Road 250 and Pecan Bayou.

County Road 240 and Pecan Bayou.

County Road 220 and South Creek.

County Road 429 and Turkey Creek.

County Road 452 and Turkey Creek.

County Road 310 and Sheep Creek.

County Road 304 and Eubank Creek.

Other agenda items brought before the commissioners' court included:

—The commissioners' court meeting was called to order at 9:23 a.m. by County Judge Roger Corn. Present were Judge Corn, Commissioner Precinct #1 Harold Hicks, Commissioner Precinct #2 Bryan Farmer, Commissioner Precinct #3 Tom Windham, Commissioner Precinct #4 Cliff Kirkham, County

Treasurer Dianne Gunter, and County Clerk Donna Bell. Also present at the commissioners' court meeting were Lori Herrick with Davis Kinard & Co., PC; Chris Bristow with Raydon, Inc.; and Johnny Tabor with Tabor Engineering.

## Commissioners approve ambulance transportation contract for jail prisoners

The Callahan County Commissioners' Court, holding a regular meeting on Friday, June 5th, approved a contract between the Citizens Emergency Medical Service and Callahan County to provide ambulance transportation for Callahan County Jail prisoners for medical care.

On a motion by Commissioner Tom Windham and a second by Commissioner Harold Hicks, the commissioners' court voted 5-0 to approve the Healthcare Transportation Services Contract by and between Citizens EMS and Callahan County Sheriff's Department. The contract follows:

### Healthcare Transportation Services Contract

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this 5th day of June, 2009 by and between Citizens E.M.S. Inc. ("Transporter") and Callahan County Sheriff's Department ("S.O."), Effective the 5th day of June, 2009.

This agreement will remain in effect until either parties has sufficient reason for change or to dissolve such agreement, in which (30) days notice shall be given by either party.

a. S.O. desires to obtain professional healthcare transportation services for the transfer of equipment supplies and inmates.

b. Transporter desires to provide such services and has the necessary equipment, training expertise, professional certifications and licenses.

1. Transporter shall bill Medicare, Medicaid, third party insurance prior to the billing of the S.O. whenever applicable.

2. For services in which the

BLS Transfer, transportation only for non-emergency care, \$155.00 base. Mileage: \$6.25/loaded. Contract rates are based on Medicare allowable.

## City of Cross Plains Begins Work to Repair Old and Delapidated Water Lines

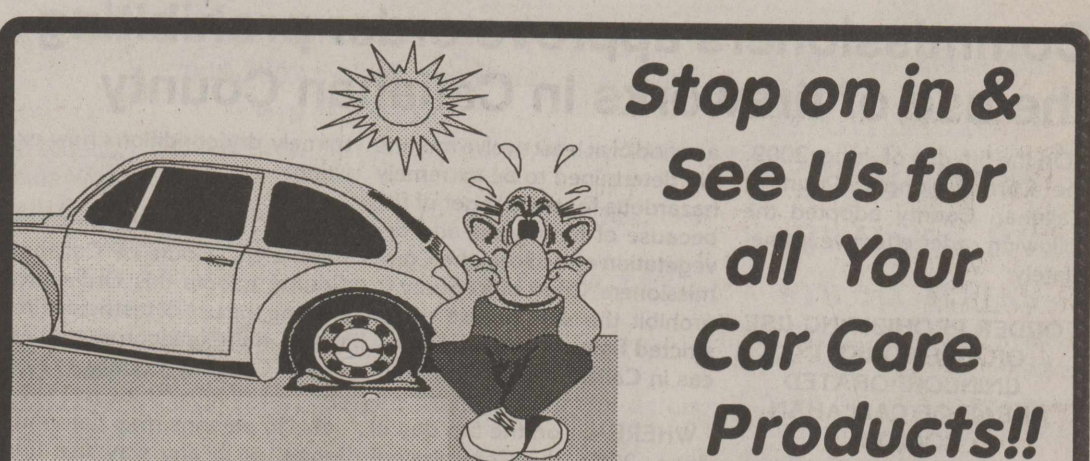
Last week the City of Cross Plains repaired two major water leaks, one behind the Subway and one in Avenue E, west of Mexico City. Both repairs were made quickly and no one was without water during the repairs. City Employees worked Sunday afternoon unstoping the sewer main on Highway 36 and Liveoak. This main line continues to give problems and is in need of repair due to the aging condition.

Representatives from the TCEQ met with City Administrator, Debbie Gosnell, to discuss the complaint they received concerning the major sewer line collapse at the Kenneth Beeler home. TCEQ has required the City to smoke test the line to see if there are additional problems with the main line and to address any problems found. The city crew will be testing this line on June 8th beginning at 1:00p.m. Residents living off the Alley between Avenue D and Avenue C from NW 2nd Street to NW 3rd Street are informed that there may be smoke coming out of their vent pipes or any open or cracked lines located upon their private property as well. Any private property that has open lines will also be subject to this mandated requirement to hire a plumber and have this section of lines repaired.
