



A memorial service is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. Saturday, June 13, 2009 at the Cottonwood Baptist Church in Cottonwood with Matt McGowen officiating; internment will follow in the Cottonwood Cemetery.

Our beloved mother Jane Muelberger Purvis passed away in Austin on April 22, 2009. A former resident of Cottonwood, she moved to Wimberly, Texas in 1998 after the death of her husband John Purvis in 1996. Janet was born in Hoboken, New Jersey, on June 26, 1918, and graduated from Columbia Presbyterian School of Nursing in 1940.

She served as an army nurse in World War II, where she met her husband John. They married in Baltimore, Maryland in 1944, and both served in Europe. After the war, Janet and John moved to Cottonwood to the Purvis homestead where they reared five children.

Janet worked for several years as the RN for Dr. Carl Sohns in Cross Plains. She left that position to teach nursing at Hendricks Memorial Hospital in Abilene, and she ended her nursing career as Director of Nursing at El Graham Hospital in Cisco.







NIPPER'S MASTER'S VOICE

During the mid-twentieth century, one of the most recognizable brand icons in America was a dog sitting in front of an old-time gramophone, head cocked, listening to the sound. That iconic image, owned by RCA Victor record company, was taken from a painting by English artist Francis Barraud. The dog, Nipper, had been owned by Barraud's brother who had recorded his voice on early phonograph records. After the brother died, Barraud inherited Nipper, the gramophone and records. Whenever the records with Nipper's master's voice were played, the dog would sit in front of the gramophone listening to his master's voice.

That's a beautiful image of the relationship between Jesus Christ and us. He has gone away from earth, so we can no longer hear his physical voice. But we sit in front of His Word and listen to our Master's teachings.

Listening for the Master's voice is a sign of loyalty and longing an indication that we are eager to hear and obey.



New School Immunization Requirements Effective August 1st

school Changes to immunization requirements for five vaccines take effect Augugust 1st according to Texas Department of State Health Services officials.

"The changes were made to update the Texas elementary and secondary school immunization requirements to more closely match recommendations by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices," said Jack Sims, DSHS immunization branch manager.

Changes affect mainly students entering kindergarten and seventh grade. All immunizations must be completed by the first day of attendance at public and private schools. The vaccines and new requirements are:

• Hepatitis A vaccine: entering Students kindergarten statewide must have had two doses of the hepatitis A vaccine.

• Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) vaccine: Students entering kindergarten must have had two doses of the MMR vaccine. Students in grades 1 through 12 must continue to meet the current requirement, which is two doses of a measles-containing vaccine and one dose each of mumps and rubella vaccine.

• Varicella vaccine: entering Students kindergarten and seventh grade must have had two

• Tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussiscontaining vaccine (Tdap): Students entering seventh grade must have had one dose. of Tdap vaccine. Students in seventh grade must have had a booster dose of Tdap, but only if it has been five years since their last dose of a tetanuscontaining vaccine. Students in grades 8 through 12 must have had a booster dose of Tdap if it has been 10 years since their last dose of a tetanus-containing vaccine.

 Menigococcal vaccine: Students entering seventh grade must have had one dose. "A student may be enrolled provisionally if the student has received at least one dose of each required vaccine," Sims

said. "To remain enrolled, the student must complete the required doses in each vaccine series on schedule and as quickly as is medically feasible "

Information about the new Texas immunization requirements was sent to health care providers, schools and child-care facilities earlier this year.
