Young Price suffered severe injuries, many broken bones and a back injury which to now has left him paralyzed from his chest down. Friends here received a card from Mrs. Price yesterday in which she described her son's condition as still critical although slightly improved. Doctors give him only a slight chance for recovery, it was indicated.
