Testimony has shown how this onerous bill would decimate the ranks of weekly and daily newspapers and magazines and add literally thousands from these and allied industries to the unemployment rolls.

It is time to direct the Post Office Department to accelerate the electronic handling of mail and otther mechanization to cut costs, with the objective of possible rate reductions, instead of further increases.
