His work in the Baptist church extended throughout the state. He was a member of the board of Buckner Orphan's Home in Dallas and of Hardin-Simmons University. He had a leading part in financing the J. B. Tidwell building on the campus of Baylor-University in Waco and was a founder and leader of the Paisano Baptist Encampment near Marfa. He was honored there this year on the 50th anniversary of the encampment.

In 1959, Mr. Hoover and his wife donated 40,000 volumes of the "Soul Winner" New Testament for each pastor and leader of the Southern Baptist Convention.

Mr. Hoover is survived by one sister, Mrs. Myrtle Mitchell of Ozona, and a number of nieces and nephews.

Camey 0. On two occasions in the fourth quarter, the Lions drove to the Badger 20 before barely missing the first downs inside the 20.

The Ozona offense operated smoothly despite the weather, but defense was not to be outdone. The front four Sutton, Farris, J. DeHoyos, and West, aided by cornermen Maney, Flores, and Applewhite, plus the linebacking of Ramos and Kilgore, did not give the Badger offense, operated by quarterback Warren Jeter, time to get untracked. Repeatedly the Badgers backs wer stopped at the line of scrimmage and managed to eke out only 34 yards rushing for the evening. Sutton led the defense as he was credited with 14 tackles following film grading by Coaches Sam Mosley and Bill Gerber. Kilgore, Flores, and Ramos had 9, 8, and 7 tackles.

Clepper completed 2 of 4 passes for 39 yards and the Lions piled up 14 first down. McCamey completed 2 of 8 with 3 intercepted for 25 yard and 5 first downs. In addition to the 174 yards rushing, Cox grabbed 1 pass for 37 yards and returned 4 punts for 94 yards. The Badgers lost the ball once and the Lions, although fumbling twice, did not lose the ball. Cox punted twice for a 36 yard average, and John Harris of McCamey punted 6 times for 40.0. Ozona lost 55 yards on penalties, and McCamey was penalized once for 5 yards.
