



BB Loading Trick

Kids have a hard time re-BB's. They can make the operation easier by saving Dad's oiling cans and filling them with BB shot.

Then they need only insert the nozzle of the can into the loading magazine to pour in the shot.

# Fishing With An Active Cork

One of the drawbacks to fishing with a cane pole and cork float is that your cork usually stays in one spot.

You can make your cork and line travel every-whichway by sticking a couple of six-inch-long feathers in the top of the cork.

Do this and your flat will range over a wide area, in keeping with the breeze, carrying the bait in a very lifelike manner.

### Another Coffee Can Use

"The last issue of the Rocksprings Rustler of 1897, which was found in some of cur long-forgotten files expressed this caustic rivalry.

"In this particular instance the rivalry goes a bit deeper than is obvious by the reproduction. Mention is made of a coming state election in which the publisher of the Rustler is a political foe of Claude Hudspeth, publisher of the Ozona Courier.

"In view of this information it appears that the Rustler publisher placed the advertisement in the final issue of his own newspaper at the expense of the good people of Ozona.

"Advertisements of the type werenot uncommon in that period of American journalism before writers and publishers became more responsible.


