### WATER SIX FEET DEEP

In Streets of San Antonio; Cars, Phones and Lights Out; Four Drowned.

San Antonio, Texas, Oct. 2.—With the San Antonio river out of banks and overflowing the downtown streets to a depth in some places of five or six feet, business in San Antonio was demoralized this morning. The damage in flooded basements and houses can not be estimated at this time, but will probably reach into the hundreds of thousands.

Street car service, telephone service and the electric light plant were out of commission during the morning. Houses in the low lying districts were flooded and several on the river banks were washed away. So far as learned this morning no lives were lost.

Swollen by a rainfall of 7.79 inches during the last 36 hours, the San Antonio river last night flooded the business district, doing at least \$500,000 damage. Four lives were lost. They were Mrs. Amelia Villanueva, wife of a Mexican laborer, living near the Hot Wells, and her three children.

The family, in fear of flood, was seeking higher ground at 9 o'clock last night, when they were caught in the flood and swept down stream. Their bodies have not been recovered. The husband and father, Juan Villanueva, clung to the top of a partly submerged tree until rescued at 9 o'clock. Although weak, from exposure, he will recover.

The water broke over the banks of the river shortly after midnight and raced down St. Mary street, which for a distance runs parallel with the stream. It flooded the basements of the Gunter hotel and all other business houses on St. Mary street. A number of city bridges were torn from their moorings, as were several hundred houses in the flats on the west side of town.

The river rose so high that it put out the fire under the boilers in the waterworks and the city now is dependent upon the supply from a small reservoir. Reports from the watershed drained by the San Antonio river are to the effect that it is still raining and fears are expressed that by tonight the flood will be worse.

### ERECTED NEW TEXAS

MEMORIAL AT GETTYSBURG.

First Southern State Memorial on West Confederate Avenue is Erected.

Women of the Confederacy Finance the Plan.

The first monument to be erected on West Confederate avenue by a southern state was put in position on Wednesday when the granite memorial to Hood's Brigade was raised. The expense of the monument is borne by the Texas Division, United Daughters of the Confederacy, Mrs. Mabel M. Bates, chairman.

The monument is of two large granite stones, placed on a heavy foundation and containing a suitable inscription. Hood's Brigade was composed of the First, Fourth and Fifth Texas Infantry and the Third Arkansas Infantry. It was commanded by Brigadier General J. B. Robertson, father of General Felix Robertson who was Texas'

### SWINDLING IS ALLEGATION.

#### Jefferson County Official and Another Man on Trial.

Beaumont, Texas, October 6.—County Commissioner Jesse B. Peek, charged in two indictments with swindling in connection with the purchase of building material for Jefferson county, was placed on trial in the Sixtieth District Court here today before Judge John M. Conley and a jury, the latter being selected from 45 talesman.

J. R. Adams of Port Arthur, against whom there are similar indictments and who is also charged in two separate accounts with false swearing in connection with several lumber bills paid by the county, will be tried separately and his case will be introduced immediately upon the completion of the present trial which will probably last all week.

Both defendants are well known citizens of Jefferson county and keen interest is manifested in the trial. Representing the defendants are Attorneys R. A. Greer, J. A. Harrison, Joe Duff, Joe Williams, Adams of Orange, a brother of J. R. Adams, and Watts & Wheat. E. A. McDowell is assisting County Attorney Maryin Scurlock in the prosecution.

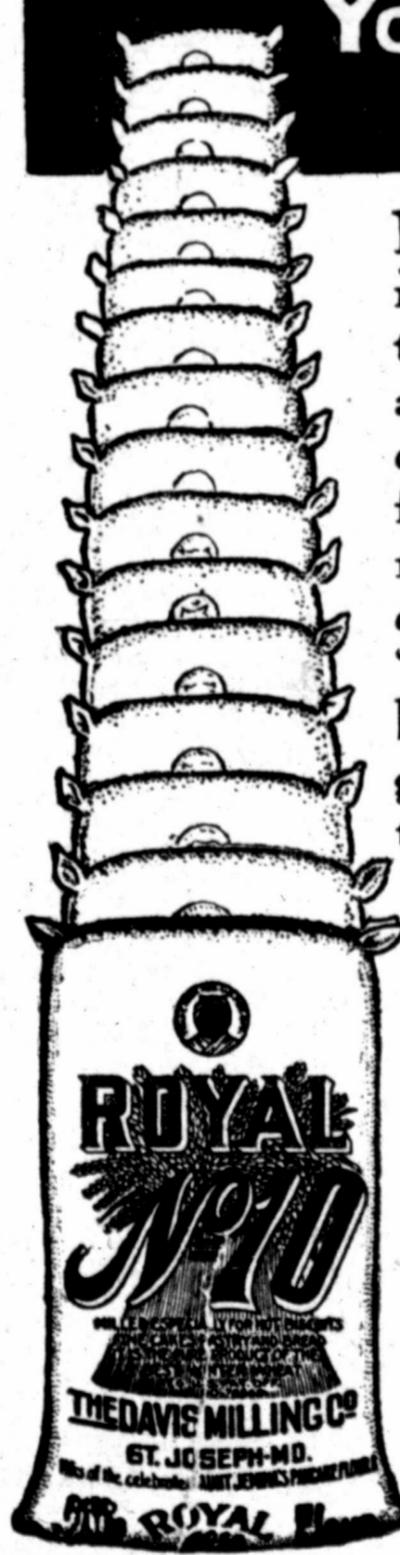

#### Bought Lot for New Jail.

The county commissioners met in special session last week, approved the assessor's rolls and transacted other business, among which was the purchase of a lot for the new jail building. The lot was bought from W. A. Norris, contains 60x110 feet and the price paid is \$1580. The location is on Tchopitoulas street, across that street from the present jail and about a half block further south.

The court employed O. Petersen to superintend construction at a salary of \$240. The San Antonio Steel Structural Company has the contract.

#### For Better Farming Methods.

R. P. Elrod, assistant agricultural and immigration agent for the I. & G. N. railway, was in Crockett Saturday conferring with the people in regard to a school house organization campaign for better farming methods. Three experts will comprise his party. Col. C. C. French of the Fort Worth stock yards will talk hogs. The state department of agriculture will be represented by Wm. Connally. Mr. Elrod's subject will be the seed patch and seed selection. They will make an organization campaign in Houston county from school house to school house and as soon as their itinerary is arranged it will appear in the Courier.

#### District Court in Session.

District court convened in regular session Monday morning. Judge John S. Prince of Athens presiding. The grand jury was empaneled as follows: T. S. Kent, George E. Darsey, J. O. Kelley, W. P. Conner, John Breazeale, Dan E. Holcomb, J. O. Monday, W. D. James, John LeGory, Jeff Kennedy, W. A. Norris and S. A. Cook. George E. Darsey of Grapeland was appointed foreman.

Ed Pool, negro, charged with murder, set for November 3 and fifty veniremen ordered.

Sam Manning, white, charged with murder, set for November 5 and sixty veniremen ordered.

#### Wreck Sunday Morning.

Southbound passenger train No. 1, Longview to Houston, was wrecked two miles south of Crockett Sunday morning at 9:20. The train was on time and running at the usual rate of speed when a soft spot in the roadbed was encountered. The engine tender, the mail car, the baggage and express car and a coach left the rails and buckled to the side in V shape. Chas. Hall, a colored passenger from Crockett, sustained a wrenched back. No other injuries were reported. Two of the cars, a coach and a chair car, remained on the track. An engine was hitched to these and they returned to Palestine as train No. 2, northbound, the passengers having transferred from the regular passenger train at the wreck. The train from Houston took the passengers from the wrecked train and returned to Houston.

#### Friday's Race Program.

Houston County Fair races were rained out Wednesday and Thursday. On Friday three running races were put on, the track being too muddy for harness races. The first event was a quarter mile dash for Houston county horses, purse \$50. The horses and the order in which they finished follow:

Lady Withers, sorrel mare, owned by Jim Cook, first; Francis C., sorrel mare, owned by G. W. Simpson, second; Shadow, sorrel gelding, owned by Dave Long, third; Dan Patch, chestnut gelding, owned by Frank Foster, fourth; Ratterree, sorrel gelding, owned by V. E. Sterling, fifth.

Houston county has some thoroughbreds. The second event was a three-eighths mile dash, purse \$70, the horses finishing as follows:

Labess, bay gelding, owned by Bybee of Willis, first; Hiram Baker, brown horse, owned by H. S. Brannon of San Angelo, second; George Washington, bay gelding, owned by George Moore of Waco, third; Dan Lee, bay gelding, owned by W. T. Bruton of Lovelady, fourth.

Hiram Baker was leading the race until his rider plunged him into a mud hole, which caused him to take second place. The third and last race was a half mile dash, purse \$90, as follows:

Colonel Austin, bay gelding, owned by George Moore of Waco, first; Annie Harper, bay mare, owned by D. B. Bryan of El Campo, second; Flowerdale Maid, sorrel mare, owned by Garrett of Timpson, third.

About sixty horses—runners, pacers and trotters—were stabled here during the fair. They were shipped out Saturday and Monday, going to Tyler and Timpson, where they will race next week. The fairs at Hillsboro and Nacogdoches for this week were called off on account of mud. These horses will next race at Dallas and from Dallas they will go to Shreveport and San Angelo. Following San Angelo, Lockhart will hold a county fair and race meet.
