To keep small children busy I have them learn the formation of little words just as early as possible, then after each recitation of the intermediate classes I take the little ones for five minutes work on the chart. When they have reached the point that they can spell words readily on the book, one recitation I have them use the primer, next first reader, then the chart; by that means they do not get tired. I put work on the blackboard by forming two columns one printed words and one script, I have them call these words with me, once or twice, then have them put these same words on their slates. The next time I allow them to put the same on the blackboard. They will soon look forward with pleasure to the time for printing and script writing. 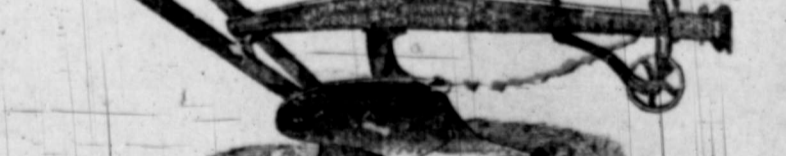

## A MINORITY REPORT.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE  
AND TARIFF.

The Bill of the Majority, Instead of Rais-  
ing Revenue, Lowers It \$74,000,000  
and Transfers the Burden from For-  
eigners to Americans.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22.—The report  
of the minority of the members of the  
ways and means committee on the  
tariff bill was submitted to the house  
yesterday. The report begins by say-  
ing the most surprising thing about  
the bill is the fact that this propo-  
sition to raise revenue will lower the  
revenue \$74,000,000 a year, the revenue  
of 1933, which was only \$2,000,000  
above expenses. This fact and the  
other fact that by this bill the larger  
part of the burden of taxation is trans-  
ferred from foreigners and brought to  
our own citizens should always be  
kept in mind during the discussion.

It then goes on to say that the major-  
ity has not only given a tariff for  
revenue only bill and therefore the  
measure is not a mainly attempt to  
carry out the program of the ways  
and means committee. After some space  
devoted to argument upon the basis  
of the party platform, the report gives  
as an instance of inconsistency that  
boards placed, tongue and grooved,  
saying that although lumber passes  
the workmen's hands, it is not pro-  
tected while the work of men who  
run planers are shielded by the  
protective tariff taxes. The plan,  
the report says, also involves a new  
method of encouraging manufacturers  
giving them "free raw material" so  
what goes into the mills pays all  
taxes and what goes into consumption  
pays all the taxes. Then, too, wool,  
coal and iron are not put on the  
free list with any reference direct or  
indirect to the tariff.

Party feeling was very high at the

AFTER THEIR MARRIAGE ROBS  
HER OF \$5000.

Four Men Struck by an Engine and Three

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Dec. 22.—  
Lincoln Potter, a young man who has

the last time Potter saw his wife  
and husband. Then she learned he had  
run off with another woman. She  
offered a reward of \$200 for his arrest.  
Potter was known here as William  
Day until detectives discovered his  
real name. A reward of \$200 was  
used to purchase a saloon here.

NEW ORLEANS, La., Dec. 20.—A  
verdict in the second of the suits  
brought against the city of New Or-  
leans on account of the lynching of  
the Italians at the parish prison on  
March 14, 1891, was rendered yester-  
day. It awards \$5000 damages to  
young Marchese himself, alias Gri-  
maldi, whose father was murdered  
on that day. Young Marchese him-  
self was accused of being implicated  
in the murder and it was charged  
that he gave the whistle which  
announced the approach  
of Chief Hennessy, where-  
upon the mob members of the

# HANDLING BIG MAILS

## THE FOREIGN DEPARTMENT AT NEW YORK CITY.

How Communication is Kept Up Between the People of the United States and Those of South America and Europe—Sorting the Letters.

THE SERVICE OF the foreign department of the New York postoffice is the most important means of international communication known to the citizens of this country.

If you walk along the gallery that overlooks the city department of the New York postoffice where even in broad daylight there twinkle thousands of electric lights, you will come to a stairway which leads you to the northern end of the building, and there, in cramped, insufficient quarters, a corps of fifty men are busily sorting out each week from Europe alone an average of 100,000 foreign letters to residents of New York, and 300,000 additional letters addressed to out of town carriers.

The letters from this country to Europe are of course carried to other countries under contracts made by the government, and the report of the office at New York is the basis upon which payment is made. This is true of all mail handled at New York with the exception of the mail from Canada which merely passes through the office in transit.

In all calculations the foreign department uses the gramme as the standard of weight and the centime as the standard of value, and the convenience of this system, especially where weight is concerned, may readily be seen from the fact that each letter is supposed to weigh ten grammes, so if it happened to be one week during this month, 6,237,170 grammes, the number of letters would be 623,717. This number is used only for rough estimates, for the United States mail is as accurately accounted for as though each letter were a fortune in itself, and the letter bill which accompanies the mail of the outgoing steamer is lettered, numbered and marked in such a way as to indicate the exact number of bags, newspapers, letters and registered letters.

The poverty of the department at the present time is made evident by the fact that many of the official letters which were printed when Postmaster Van Cott was in office are still in use, and the government printer at Washington sends them to foreign ports with the name of Postmaster Dayton stencilled over that of his predecessor.

### A GREAT CORAL REEF.

A Thousand Miles Long and Enclosing an Island Sea.

One of the marine wonders of the world is the great barrier reef of Australia. This stupendous rampart of coral, stretching in an almost unbroken line for 1,250 miles along the north-eastern coast of Australia, and the water lines of which are not to be equalled in any other portion of the globe. Nowhere is the action of the little marine insect, which builds up with untiring industry those mighty monuments with which the tropical seas are studded, more impressively shown than where the wonderful constructive forces of nature more apparent. By a simple process of accretion there has been raised in the course of centuries an adamantine wall against which the billows of the Pacific sweep along in an unbroken line for a distance of several thousand miles, dash themselves in ineffectual fury. Inclosed within the range of its protecting arms is a calm inland sea, some 200 miles in extent, dotted with a multitude of coral islets and presenting at every turn objects of intense interest to the unlearned traveler and the man of science. Here may be witnessed the singular process by which the coral grows, a living mass hardens into stone, then serves as a collecting ground for the botanist and jettison of the ocean, and ultimately forms an island covered with a luxuriant mass of tropical growth. Here, again, may be seen in the most striking manner the placid pools extraordinary forms of marine life, aglow with the most brilliant colors and producing in their innumerable variety a bewilderment of the vastness of the life of the ocean.

### FOR PHOTOGRAPHS.

How a Useful Article for the Household Can Be Made.

What shall be done with the photographs which are yearly so numerous? There have been albums and photograph frames and bags, both small and great, in which to deposit them, but the most useful and prettiest idea for a photograph case is to take a piece of cardboard of any size desired, and cover it with a piece of silk. Cover another piece slightly smaller, as in drawing, joining this to the first, and still another piece, slightly smaller than the second, and by means of delicate maindair ferns in natural shades in corner four, tacking this to the third piece of covered board. Or

this corner may be made of white or ecrú leather. Fasten the outside edges together, leaving spaces between each card for the photographs, and finish the case with a bow of pale green ribbon to match the ferns. For amateur photographers another suggestion is to make an album of water color paper, in which the unmounted "snap shots" may be pasted and the album outlined with splashes of gilt. The outside of the album is of heavy pasteboard covered with linen and decorated with lettering suggested by the title. This classifies the photographs and gives one's friends the pleasure of a camera's sketchbook.

### A Historical Traveler Sign.

G. C. Kennedy of Lancaster, Pa., has just come into possession of a tavern sign that has a history worth recording, beginning, as it does, prior to the American Revolution. It was painted in 1771 by Benjamin West, the first great American painter, who was at the time unknown to fame. It first swung in front of the Thronton of the old road, as the thoroughfare was called, in Salisbury township.

The neighborhood was settled by English emigrants, whose loyalty to England was offensively manifested during the revolutionary struggle. The tavern, kept by a Tory of the deep, was the headquarters of these people, and the old sign bears the mark of hostility felt toward the proprietor by the patriots. A body of continental troops, passing the place one day, fairly ridiculed the sign, and the proprietor himself came near sharing a similar fate.

In 1816 the sign was removed to the Waterloo tavern, in the township of White Horse, a place kept by another Englishman. Only one side of the sign was changed by the removal, the Waterloo tavern taking the place of the picture of the Three Crowns.

In 1830 the old sign changed once more, going to the White Horse hotel, still in Salisbury township. The Waterloo Tavern is now the handsome country residence of a wealthy Philadelphia, Nathaniel Bart. At the White Horse the sign swung unchanged until quite recently.

John Mason was proprietor of that tavern when the sign was brought there to do service, and since his time Henry Whiteside and Frank Sedgwick have kept the hotel. The sign is a large, nearly square affair, the hindwork of the famous painter being visible only now, so weather beaten is the woodwork.

## INVENTIONS WHICH WILL LESSEN MANUAL LABOR.

Electrical and Metallurgical Science as developed by the Great Exhibition of 1883.

### Water Circulating Grate.

A new water circulating grate is designed for marine, stationary and locomotive boilers, and is made of all classes of fuel without change of bars. No artificial draft is required, and the circulation is designed to keep the boiler clean. The operation of the grate is as follows:

It is the feet pipe; O is where the water enters the grate from the feed; M is a valve to shut off blowing surface flow; L is a reversed check which

disclosure of an iron blast furnace, arranged to give strong evidence of being intended to heat, in its descent, a blast of outside air forced through passages before entering the chamber at the level where tuyeres are usually found. ### A Simple Electrical Machine.

The inventor of a simple electrical machine, acquires the property of attracting light objects was known as long as 17th centuries ago. This first experiment in electricity was destined for a splendid future, but a distant one, since it is from yesterday only that date the truly serious applications of this science.

We shall now endeavor to show how the fundamental experiments of electricity may be performed with a sheet of paper will suffice us in the first place for a few interesting experiments. Heat a piece of ordinary paper in front of a brisk fire or over a lamp chimney, and when it is thoroughly terwarb it is smartly with the hand or better, with a brush, and it will be found to be capable of attracting small, light objects such as fragments of thin paper and the web of feathers. If the sheet of paper be brought near a table, or any stationary object, whatever it will be strongly attracted. Finally, if one places it above his head, he will be attracted, while at the same time he will experience a sensation, comparable to a slight tickling.

But more remarkable results still are obtained upon the paper when it is taken a glass, expose it to the fire, so that it shall be perfectly dry, and place upon the pipe to the grate, and then ward take a tray, perfectly dry, and place it upon the glass in such a way that it shall preserve its equilibrium. Finally, take a sheet of paper slightly smaller than the tray, heat it and rub it rapidly with a brush and it will be attracted to the tray. Then place it upon the tray.

An electrical machine will thus have been made, and the sparks which appear, if the finger be brought near the tray, a spark will appear. This spark will be so much the longer in proportion as the glass is more dried.

If, while the sparks are being drawn from the tray, the room in which the experiment is performed, be dark, the sparks will appear extremely brilliant.—Science Illustrate.

### Oil Versus Coal.

Mrs. Stone, Bureau of Cores, Ltd. of Wight, owner of the yacht Venture, which was fitted with steam machinery, has had her engine, made and replaced by Vosper & Co. of Portsmouth. The vessel would not before steam against the wind, but now she can sail as well as with ease; she could also only conveniently carry sufficient coal for six hours' steaming, but now she carries a space which was before quite useless, therefore taking up no available room.—Industries.

### New Coal Vain in Mexico.

An extensive vein of coal has been discovered thirteen leagues from Pachuca, the present terminus of the Mexican Central Pacific branch line. The coal is said to be of good quality, as shown by all the tests. The lack of fuel has been a serious difficulty with this company, and the opening up of extensive coal deposits anywhere in Mexico is therefore most important reduction in the operating cost of the property.
