

Teachers' Certificates.

County Judge Finlay received the following letter from State Superintendent Carlisle, which is of interest to the teachers and trustees of public schools:

Attention is also invited to the subject of teachers' certificates. No teacher is legally competent to contract to teach in a public school unless at the time of contracting he holds a certificate valid where the. contract requires him to teach. Furthermore, no one can legally continue to teach in a public school after his certificate expires. In no case can a teacher legally receive any compensation out of public school funds for teaching done while he had no certificate valid where the service was performed. Again, no one can indirectly re-

ceive school funds for any service for which they can not directly be paid. Hence it is entirely unlawful for trustees to contract with one teacher having a certificate for a larger sum than they in fact intend him to have, with the understanding that he is to pay part of it to another person having no certificate for assistance. In fact, the Intention of the law plainly is to prohibit from teaching in the public schools any person who has not a certificate, owever he may be paid. Every. teacher is required to have his own certificate, to make his own contract with the trustees, and to have the contract approved by the County Superintendent. Even if all the teachers have certificates, it is not legal to permit one teacher to contract for all, or, indeed, for anyone vouchers each teacher should have his own voucher and make his own affidavit to its correctness.
