subscriptions to the new 3 per cent war loan of $\$ 200,000,000$, which was closed of the offers made by syndicates, amounts to $\$ 1,200,000$, 000 or six times the amount of the issue.

making a short circle, and came to our port side, so that I thought she
would ram us. I moved in toward would ram us. I moved in toward
the shore so I could avoid her, then I saw that the Oquendo had gone
ashore also, her steam pipes evi-
dently having been severed by dently having been severed by
shell. The maneuver of
Brooklyn was beautiful. opened a rapid fire at her with al our big guns, but she returned it
with terrible effect. The Oregon also hit us several times, but the
Brooklyn's broadside, crashing Brooklyn's broadside, crashing
into our superstructure, simply
terre terrorized the men. We worked
all our gunsat her at one time, and
