REMOVAL OF THE CAPITAL.

plan has been accepted for a War Department Building; a. bill has passed the Senate for the paying of Pennsylvania avenue, part of the expenses to be borne by the United States; Mayor Bowen recommends application to Congress for an appropriation to improve the water front here, and a committee of Mr. Stanton's testimony. of business men has already been formed, in pursuance of the Mayor's recommendation, not to apply to Congress therefor, and to work up the necessary interest and influence for success; and a new Executive Mansion project is being strennously pushed. COLUMBUS, Texas, February 20, 1869. Editor San Antonio Express :

Leaving San Antonio in good

We took breakfast in Belmont; and at Gonzales our coach, or rather mud wagen, became uncomfortably crowded. Arriving at "Sweet Home," we were informed that we must wait the stage from below, as the same team would take us on to Halletsville; here we waited until next day about 11 o'clock-12 hours. We arrived here (Columbus) this morning at 2 o'clock-having been sixty hours on the road; and here we must remain until to-morrow, when we will have a chance to go by "hand-ear" to Richmond, and from there on Tuesday to Harrisburg, and may possibly reach Galveston by Wednesday noon-making seven day from San Antonio.

During these seven days the traveler must put up with horrid fare and miserable accommodations The saying that "God sends food, but the devil sends cooks," applies well to the taverns and stands on the Columbus route. Taking all things into consideration, the Indianola route is the surest, safest, shortest, and best, for all travelers eastward bound. Stamp Duties on Articles

A number of grocers in different parts of the country have got into trouble through inattention to or gnorance of their obligations under the revenue laws with respect to ar-ticles liable to stamp. We will state ticles liable to stamp. We will state explicity for the information of such that, Sardines, Anchovies, Prepared Mustard, Sirups in Bottles, Jams. Jellies, Mest and Fish sauces of dif-ferent kinds, Colognes, Cosmetics, and all the articles enumerated in Schedule C, as printed below, are liable to stamp duty, whether made in the United States or imported. The stamp must be affixed on each package offered or exposed for sale. An article is offered or exposed for said when placed on the shelves, or Prepared Mustard, Jams, and Jellies. are subject to tax according to the weight of each package; a one-cent stamp if the package does not exceed two pounds in weight, and stamp of additional cent for every pound or fraction of a pound in excess of two

pounds in weight. Parties selling imported articles of the kind mentioned, must affix and cancel appropriate stamp, such articles being subject to the like stamp Where the importer sells in the original packages, i. e., those in which the original manufacturer or producer furnishes them to the trade, and not the single package which the rotailer sells to a customer, he need not break open such original package and stamp each separate article, but may sell the same without stamp in the original package, case or box, and the dealer who breaks the package to sell a single article, must affix and cancel stamps on each. The ab sence of stamp from an article offers of or exposed for sale is prima facie

evidence of fraud. Canned Fruits, Canned Vegetables and Canned Oysters, are exempt. Dry Mustard is exempt ; also Olives Capers and Pickles. Cooking Essences, and Extracts are also exempt. But all Essences, Extracts, Toilet Waters, Cosmetics, including Bay Rum and Florida Water, Hair Oils, Pomades, Tooth Waters, Powders, Dentrifices of all kinds, are subject to stamp. Boxes of Aromatic Cachous, Pastiles or Troches, must be stamped, and Matches, Wax Lights, spirits we arrived at the first stand on the Cibolo before sundown. 
