The Constitutional Convention.

It seems to be the fate of legicla tive bodies in these times to suffer abuse. The disposition to malign and misrepresent such assemblies appears to be chronic. The Congress of the United States has been held up as the very embodiment of political misrule; every Southern Convention has been described as a menagerie; and every Legislature in the late rebel States has been represented as an intolerable abomination. It was, therefore, expected that the Texas Constitutional Con vention would receive its share of reproach. But we were not prepared for the wholesale and almost universal condemnation with which it has been visited. We did hope that it would so conduct itself and inaugurate such measures of reconstruction as would command the re Be this as it may, we are certainly spect and support of the loyal and With humiliation we now confess our disappointment. | We do not unite in censuring it. It is certainly, die, as fate shall decree. a remarkable phenomenon in our politics, that both parties declare themselves ashamed of the body; and it would only increase the marvel, if both parties should agree to

adopt its work. When the Convention first assemoled, its friends, perhaps, expected too much, and its enemies expected too little of it. The Conservatives opposed it from the begining. The odor of the African was about it, and they had not then abandoned the hope of defeating colored suff rage. They have learned something since. On the other hand, many Republicans were disposed to ignore the disloyal element as a power in society, and were bent on manipulating the Convention for mere party purposes. They, too, have learned something since.

That there were some able minds in the body cannot be denied; but that intellect did not control its deliberations is equally without question. For once brains were at a discount. Full two-thirds of the members were Republicans; but that they failed to enforce all the leading ideas of the party is patent to all.

The prolonged discussion of the ab initio question was doubtless the cause of this strange denouement. This was the apple of discord among Republicans. We assume that all on both sides were sincere. But this must be recorded, that every truth. member was judged by each faction issue. It was made the test of destructiveness on the one hand, and of apostacy on the other. Motives were impugned, irritation ensued. and the breach widened, till finally the two wings stood apart like frown ing cliffs, with a hinge chasm be tween, to cross which was desertion. The division of the State, politically cated by many as a remedy for ex isting divisions. But, instead of pacifying, its introduction seemed only to increase the animosity. Up to this time, the Convention

ras in had repute with Conservatives generally. It had done nothing to gratify them; whilst its proed pession, its heavy expendi tures, its legislative acts, and its bitter disamsions slienated many Republicans. Gen. Canby on Texas.

Washington, Feb. 28.—Gen. Camby writing to the Secretary of War from Austin, Feb. 4, says, the convention has completed Feb. 4. says, the convention has completed the constitution for Texas, and it will be constitution for rexas, and a ware submitted to the people some time in July. Cauby suggested so late a day, being influenced by the following reasons: In thirty-counties there is no civil organization in connection with the State Government; in some sparsely settled counties there is no civil organization whatever; in others in some sparsely settled counties there is no civil organization whatever; in others only partial, in other counties, completely organized, county officers have failed to recognize the Secretary of State, or make reports to him; some counties are so remote that it requires twenty-five to forty days for mail communication. Gen.Canqy thinks it will take at least ninety days to perfect the civil organization throughout the State. The registrars of last election being discharged, the original lists are not on file; means, however, have been taken on file; means, however, have been taker to collect the original lists and rearrange to collect the original fists and rearrange them, and reorganize the personel of the registrars. Though the condition of Texas is materially improved since November, and still improving, still in some sections the authorities of the United States and the Provisional Government is openly defied, if not resisted, and the civil power is included. fied, if not reassted, and the civil power is indifferent or powerless, while the federal force is too small to make itself respected. Canby concludes: Arrangements are now progressing which, it is hoped, will cure this evil; until that is done, a fair election as directed by the reconstruction laws, is impossible.
