But the naturalist finally came to the conclusion that it is produced by animalculæ which are excited to lumosity when the water is agitated. It was also shown that the phosphorescence is bright-est and the sparks most numerous immediately preceding an atmospheric disturbance. Thus, the little animalculæ must be included in the long list of delicate organs that feel the approach of bad weather. 


