They are hired as laborers, for most part in Alabama, to work on the railroads and other public improvements, and to Mississippi, Louisians, and Texas for the cotton fields, etc. The emigration from Virginia must necessarily increase the price of labor to a very great extent, and, unless it can be counteracted by an equal—indeed greater immigration into the State, must have a seriously depressing effect upon the price of lands in the State. A small number will leave this place to-day for Alabama, to work on the railroads. They get \$25 per month and board.


