UNITED STATES.

Passed at the Second Session of the Forty-First Congress.

[PUBLAC-No. 11.]

AN ACT giving the consent of the United States to the erection of a bridge across the Willamette river, in Oregon, from the city of Portland to the east bank of said river.

Be it enacted by the Schate and House of

Be it enacted by the Schule and House of Representatives of the Luitod States of Ameri-ca in Congress assembled, That the consent of the United States'is hereby given to the city of Portland, in the State of Ore-gon, to creek, or cause to be creeked, a gon, to erect, or cause to ue erected, a bridge, with diverging roadways and foot-ways and double draws, over and across the Williamette river, between the city of Portland and the east mank of said river, at any time within six years after the pasage of this set! Provided, That the said bridge shall be so constructed and built as not to obstruct, impair, or injuriously modify the navigation of the river; and in order to secure a compliance with these conditions, the corporation, association, or company proposing to erect the same, previous to commencing the construction of the bridge, shall submit to the Secretary of War a plan of the bridge, with a detailissuance of the bridge and for the distance of a mile above and below the site, exhibiting the depths and currents at all points of the loven months.

SECTION 1. That the ordinance passed on the 16th day of January. A. D. 1866, and hereafter published, in reference to payments made in so called Confederate currency, &c., be re-chacted with the following redirections and amounts thereof ing modifications and amendments thereof,

That all persons interested, their agents That all persons interested, their agents or assignees, are hereby required to settle with Messrs. 


