Chinese Discoveries of America.

SUNDAY, MARCH 13, 1870.

. The San Francisco people are discussing a paper by Mr J Hanlay, discovered the continent 1,400 years ago. They stated that land to be about twenty thousand Chinese miles distant from China. About priests repaired there, and brought each the news that they had found Buddhist idols and religious writings in the country. He says the Chinese called the land Fosany, after a tree like the bamboo, from which the natives made cloth and paper, and the freit of which they Mr Hanlay compares this with the statement of the Conquistadores, that the Aztecs from the pulp of a tree made paper, and used the roots and fermented spirit tor food. He relies too on a correspondence between the authorities as to the absence among the natives of other metal tools than copper, and of the little value they placed on gold and silver. Mr Hanlay affirms there is a resemblance between the religion of the Aztecs and Buddhism as well as between their manners and customs. He assert's there is a simi larity of feature between the Chinese and the tribes of Middle and South America. He goes further, and gives a list of words in the Chinese and American language which exhibit a similarity.

The Athenaum considers that these affirmations are extremely weak; and we fear most of the oth er evidence put forward by Mr Hanlay is no better. If the connection were such as Mr Hanlay supposes, it is strange the Aztecs did not adopt the Chinese characters.

What Missouri has Done.

Missouri was roughly treated during the war. Being a slaveholding State, she maturally gave powerful aid to the Southern Confeder. acy, and, under Quantrell and others of his kind, re-enacted the policy and horrors that Stringfellow and his followers initiated in Kansas. Missouri was the occasion of the earliest decisive battle between freedom and slavery-a light that resulted in that miserable inilurecompromise-"the cause of all our woes," Missonri has passed through many strange and instructive vicissitades, the most important in a legal view being that of her famous resident, Dred Scott-the most important in Congress being the attempted extention of her Compromise line to the Pacific ocean, white on the North and back on the South. During the late rebellion, the loyal men of Missouri "tought the devil with fire;" she sed rebels, and braved even the animosity of Frank Blair. She was in downright earnest, and her hand was gloved in steel.

But the time of war and revenge is over; and while others less earnest if not less brave people than hers, are halting between two opin ions and squandering precions time in doubt, Missouri comes bravely up to the true spirit of the hour. Her State Senate, by the gratifying vote of 25 to 4, has passed an amend-ment to her Constitution granting suffrage to colored men and restoring the franchise to all of her formerly rebel eitizens. It is a grand step forward—Impartial Suffrage and Universal Aunesty. We con-gratulate the brave men who have risen above the poor policy of revenge and opened wide the door for freedom to all. This amendment must go to the people for rati-fication; but we cannot doubt the result. Henceforth let the debata ble ground be counted foremost in the array of liberty and loyalty.

A Lake of Sait.

The Great Humboldt salt mine near Austin, Nevada, is described by a California paper as looking like a lake frozen over. The salt is as hard and as smooth as ice.

Were it not for fine particles which are condensed from vapors arising from beneath, and which cover the crystalline salt to the depth of perhaps one-eighth of an inch, it would make an excellent skating rink at all times of the year, except on the very unfrequent occasions when it is covered with water. The expanse of crystalized salt is no less than twenty miles in length and twelve in width, without a break or flaw for the greater portion of that extent. Tae stratum of solid salt is about six or seven inches thick, under which comes a layer of sticky, singular looking mud, about two feet thick, and under this again another stratum of solid salt as transparent as glass, of which the depth has been found in some parts to be six teet. In summer this sait plain, glittering and scintillating in the light of an almost tropical sun, presents a brilliant appearance. The frosty covering and solid salt is as white as snow, while the crystalline portion, when exposed, reflects dazzling from, prismatic colors. This immense de posit is remarkably pure, being ninety-five per cent of salt and five per ceut of soda-which is purer than what we commonly use for our






