If the company had only to build the road from the county fine of Bexar county then we would be fools to-make any donation at all, and could build that distance ourselves; but that we may have communication with Galveston, Houston and New Orleans, the stretch between Columbus and San Antonie must be completed, and this requires a heavy outlay of at least three millions. As the company must advance this for two years it is not more than fair that they should receive interest on their capital.

The great source of revenue to the company will be the transportation of cattle ; wool, hides, and every other year a few bushels of pacaus, amounting to nothing.

The company can secure the transporta tion of the cattle if they only build the read sixty or eighty miles from Columbus out in this direction, and the entire loss would fall on the city of San Antonio, as some other point on the road would receive all the advantage of having the cattle de-
