WHERE \$1,700,000 WENT.
An illustrative feature of Comptroller
Connelly's accounts is presented in an ex-
hibit of warrants drawn during three years
to the total amount of \$1,703,725.30 in
favor of the New York Printing Company,
which publishes the Transcript; and drawn
without a shred of appropriation to autho-
rize the expenditure. This amount was
thus drawn:
Warrants drawn in 1869..... \$ 519,437.10
Warrants drawn in 1870..... 1,080,090.86
Warrants drawn in 1871..... 104,203.84
Total..... \$1,703,725.36
All this, it should be remembered, was
secretly drawn from the treasury in addi-
tion to the extravagant amounts expended
for printing, stationery, &c., under resolu-
tions of the Board of Supervisors. And
this, says the Tribune, is the way it was
managed:
On the 10th of June, Mr. Tweed, who is
one of the principal partners in the New
York Printing Company (and in the Trans-
cript Association, which is only another
name for the same concern), offered the
following resolution, which the Supervi-
sors adopted unanimously, and the Mayor
signed two days afterward:
Resolved, That the Comptroller be and
he is hereby directed to pay the bills of
the New York Printing Company for all
work done for or supplies furnished the
county by them, upon the certificate of
the clerk of the board, and charge the
same to its appropriate account.
An objection to this resolution, which
would have supposed it applied
only to bills due before the board; but
we now see that it must have been in-
terpreted as a standing rule, covering all fu-
ture accounts. Thus the plain provisions
of the law, with respect to auditing and
paying bills against the city and county,
were daily evaded, and the Comptroller
was instructed to expend hundreds of
thousands of dollars annually with no
other voucher than the signature of an
irresponsible clerk. And if copies of parts
of Mr. Connelly's books had not been ob-
tained from his office secretly, so that he
has been forced to permit an examination
of the remainder, the public never would
have known how much money was drawn
from the treasury in this irregular, not to
say illegal, way, and there would have
been no check whatever upon the most
enormous frauds.

COMPARISON.
Democratic newspapers and orators are
much given to the making of charges of
extravagance against the party in power,
and of inveighing against what they term
the corrupt practices in the management of
the affairs of the Government and in the
collection of the revenue.
How completely founded are these
charges has been shown in the last
speech of Secretary DeLoe.
The comparison of Federal items of ex-
penditure under Republican management
with those of a like character in New
York under Democratic management shows
wide the margin between Democratic
extravagance and their practice
thereof whenever and wherever they can
secure control of the purse strings of the
people.
For instance, the Treasury building at
Washington, with the exception of the
United States capitol, the largest and
most costly building in the country, yet
the total cost is about \$6,000,000 against
\$19,000,000 for the uncompleted courts-
house, which is said to be about one-sixth
as large as the Treasury building.
Again, the published accounts show that
\$200,000 have been paid out ostensibly for
stationery for the use of the officers of the
County of New York.
During the same time the cost of the
stationery of the war of the United States
Department, where there are employed 2-
300 persons, making constant issues of ar-
ticles of stationery, has been about \$12,000.
Further comment is unnecessary—Phila-
delphia City Item.
