Proceedings of the City Council, Called meeting, SAN ANTONIO, Sept. 2, 1871.

Present, his honor, Mayor Thielsch, Councilmen - Messrs. Dyerler, Moon, Pen-tarider, Callaghan, Elmendorf, and Gross.

Petition of F. Poeschel, for an amount due him, was referred to the Committee on Petition Ordinances.

Petition of J. Hildebrandt, for payment of interest on an amount due by the city, was rejected.

Petition of Fire Association No. 1, for aid, was read and on motion it was voted to pay them the interest on the amount due on their building and the regular monthly allowance.

Petition of Belvin and Joyce for payment of alleged damages to their property, by the widening of Flores Street, was laid over.

Petition of Mrs. J. D. Groat for a duplicate deed of some lots purchased of the City, was read and on motion the City Attorney was authorized to examine the said matter and if found necessary, the Mayor was authorized to sign the desired Duplicate deed.

Communication of C. Hartnett, City Surveyor, offering three parts (wards 1, 2, and 4) of the new City Map, for the examination and acceptance of the Council.

VERMILION, Sept. 20. - There makes demand upon Mexico for better guarantees for faithfulness to treaty obligations before renewing diplomatic relations.

PARIS, Sept. 21. - There has assurance from Austria that nothing hostile to France occurred at Gastein.

VERMILION, Sept. 21. - President Thiers has been presented by King Amadeus of Spain with Order of Golden Fleece.

BRISBANE, Sept. 20. - Opposition to emancipation in Brazilian Parliament so obstinate that passage of the bill this session is improbable.

LONDON, Sept. 21. - Congress of Internationalists commenced in London today. Delegates from Italy, Spain, France, Belgium, Germany and Switzerland are present.

CITY OF MEXICO, Sept. 18. - It is considered a majority of new Congress favors Thiers. No signs of revolutions.

ST. FRANCISCO, Sept. 20. - Loss by San at Virginia City, Nevada, reached one and a quarter millions.
