Platform and Resolutions of the
New Brunswick Convention.

Whereas, It is customary for political
parties to announce their platform upon
the opening of a political campaign, and
particular in the case of a national cam-
paign, and it is the duty of every citizen
to be informed of the views of the
people as indicated upon issues both
national and local in their character, there-
fore be it

Resolved, That the Resolutions of the
New Brunswick Convention, in a
Convention organized, comprising the
Republican party, as the party of progress
and civilization, and we pledge ourselves,
as we have done in the past, to the
maintenance of the rights and liberties of
the people without regard to race or
color.

Resolved, We hereby declare that we
are in full harmony with the National Re-
publican party, and that we endorse
the platform, national and State, of said
party.

Resolved, That in President Grant we
recognize the standard bearer of the Re-
publican party, and that we support his
administration.

Resolved, That we have the greatest
confidence in the ability and honesty of
Gov. F. J. Davis, and heartily endorse his
administration, and particularly the prin-
ciple measure enacted, and as the matter
of the public bill, and the law prohibiting
the carrying of deadly weapons, and
the school bill, which secures to us the
protection of life and property and the edu-
cation of our children.

Resolved, That we recognize the Re-
publican party of the champion of a ju-
dicial system of internal improvements,
to develop the great resources of our State
Executive, and his firm stand against a too
lavish expenditure by subsidies for rail-
roads.

Resolved, That we emphatically instruct
our representatives to use all their power
and influence to the protection by law of
our frontier against the depredations of
the savage Indians, and that we deem it
the imperative duty of the national gov-
ernment to reimburse the State of Texas
for all the expenses incurred on account of
border protection.

Resolved, That thirty years of uninter-
mitting martial law, including the detention
of the rebellion, has left our State and
local government in dilapidation and ruin,
making it necessary now to call upon the
people to bear a heavy tax in order to es-
tablish order, suppress crime, promote
education, and to repair and erect public
buildings, and open and repair public
highways, but so soon as the means are
secured to build the necessary school houses,
and put the local government in proper
running order, we favor a reduction of
taxation, placing ourselves to state policy
and against the increase of taxation by
the granting of railroad subsidies, etc.

Resolved, That the Democratic State
Convention refusing to accept the natural
and legitimate fruits of the late rebellion,
by formally declaring to these platform
its purpose to restore the government to
its original condition, and to create the
basis of the United States in the absence of
liberty, to engage the thirteenth, four-
teenth and fifteenth amendments to the
Constitution from that instrument, and ac-
knowledge the colored man to the virtual
condition of a slave, calls for correct con-
demnation at our hands.

Resolved, That we hereby declare it to
be the determination of this Convention
to nominate the name of no man as a can-
didate for Congress who does not give his
unqualified support to the party platform
and the platform herein set forth.
