Catholic Austria soliciting from free America a full presentation of her system of popular education is one of the most suggestive movements of the Vienna Exposition. General Van Buren, the American commissioner to the Exposition, states that every letter he has received from Baron Schwartz, who has been designated by the Austrian Government to take charge of all the arrangements, had a reference to American Education, and the Bureau at Washington is in possession of a most interesting cor-

espondence on the same subject. In this correspondence Mr. Jay, our Minister to Austria, addressing the Secretary of State, urges upon his attention the desires of Baron Schwartz in the following language:

His Excellency expressed his earnest desire that the United States Government would present at the Vienna Exposition a perfect representation of the system of common-school instructions adopted in the United States, a system the results of which, he said, had been so wonderful.

He bad read with singular interest the report upon American popular education (Hippeau's) recently published in Paris, and which had attracted so much attention upon the Continent, and he prayed me to believe that an exposition of that system, illustrated by a schoolhouse and its appurtenances and its statistical results, would be a matter of profound interest, not on y to Austro-Hungary, but to the Eastern people who adjoin this Eming:

A vast amount of information is constantly being gathered and collated by the United States Signal Service respecting storms, out of which is being gradually built up the true science of that class of meteorological phenomena. Among the general observations thus far noted may be mentioned the follow-

Stormes are accompanied with a depression of the barometer near the central line of the storm, and a REAL ESTATE BROKER. rise of the barometer in the front and rear.

This central line of minimum pressure is generally of a great length from North to South, and moves side-foremost toward the sea This line is sometimes nearly straight, but generally curved, and most frequently with its convex side

toward the Bast. The velocity of this line is such that it travels from the Mississippi to the Connecticut river in about twenty-four hours, and from the Connecticuto St. John, Newfoundland, in pearly the same time, or about thirty-six miles an hour.
