The President says the cost of collecting the revenues will be much reduced during the next fiscal year; and does not recommend any change in the present laws. The report of the Sacretary of War shows the expenditures of the War Department for the fiscal year ending Jane 30, 1871, to be \$35,799,991,92, and for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1872, to be \$35,-372,157.20, showing a reduction in favor of the last fiscal year of \$427,834,68.

The estimates for military apprepriations for the next fiscal year, ending June 30, 1874, are \$33,801,478,28. The estimates of the Chief of Engineers are submitted apparately for fortifications, river and harbor improvements, and for public buildings and grounds and the Washington aqueduct.

Compared with the previous fiscal year, the increase of revenue was \$1,878,230,95, or 9,37 per cent, and the increase of expenditures \$2,968,088,93 or 9,39 per cent. Adding the ordinary revenues, the annual appropriation of \$,00,000 for free matter and the amounts paid to the subsidized mail steamship lives from special appropriations, the deficiency paid out of the general treasury was \$3,317,765,94, an excess of \$339,707,28 over the deficiency for the year 1871.


