Cotton and wool both derive their value from their characteristic spiral twist that fits them for making cloth, and it was this likeness to wool that gave option the name of tree-wool in some languages. The people of India were the first to use cotton for clothing, and the works of Heredotus, written in the fifth century before Christ, contains allusions to that fact. It is now one hundred years since the manufacture of cotton goods were first successful in Europe, though calicoes from Calicut, on the coast of Malabar, had been imported long before that time. CONGRESSIONAL COMMENTS ON THE MERSAGE.

After the President's message was read in the Senate and the House, members expressed their views very freely upon its tenor and recommendations. And it must be a gratification to the President and to the country generally, to know that a general approval of the entire contents of the message was freely expressed by members exception was taken, while the foreign pelicy of the administration was generally approved, and the measures suggested for the action of Congress were commended. Outside of Congress similar views ware expressed, and to a much greater extent than is usual, the message of the President merits the approbation of all classes.
