178 indictments, embracing 118 defendants. In South Carolina 1355 indictments have been found, under which 831 persons are embraced. Convictions, 27; acquittals, 5; plead guilty, 71; mistrials, 3; indictments discontinued, 54; pending, 118. Five persons are now on trial.

In Mississippi, 678 bills have been found; 262 convictions have followed; 23 have been acquitted; trials discontinued, 40; pending at the close of last year, 353.

The lawlessness exhibited in these States is very appalling, but the decline of it so perceptible during the last portion of the year, is a proof of the value of the Ku Klux legislation and its vigorous enforcement.

UPON the subject of railroads the people of this city are thoroughly aroused. There was a meeting of the leading citizens yesterday, and to-day there will be a meeting of the San Antonio Board of Trade, to consider the necessities of the hour. There is but one sentiment on every hand expressed. Those members of the Legislature who have betrayed their trusts, and who are apparently sold out to the east and north, receive no single word of approval. It is universally conceded that Ireland has proven himself an unquittable demagogue, and upon legal technicalities which no competent court would heed for a moment, he attempts to persuade the people of Texas to repudiation. The people of this State may not be a nice and hair splitting upon questions of honor as some other people, but it is shure to choose the right, and to be just. Repudiation and dishonor are words not to be found in its vocabulary; and whether the evil is proposed to be done directly, or in a roundabout way makes no difference. There are obligations to be complied with, and they will be heeded, in spite of the captious. Among these is the necessity of fulfilling a contract made with the International Railway and it will be fulfilled.

THE Houston Telegraph grew pen sive on Washington's birth-day, and in the International and Pacific railway business makes believe that a compromise is desirable.

There was a man convicted of swindling one of our merchants last Monday, and he no doubt, in view of the penitentiary, thinks that compromises are extraordinarily good things.

The argument of the Telegraph amounts to this: Mr. R. H. Co., we have agreed to give you so much money if you will build so much road, within a fixed time. You have done as you agreed to do, but we are sick of our bargain; let us off on the money business, and we will give you all the land you want. We don't want to stain our characters, but we have more land than we know what to do with just now, and we haven't issued the bonds to you as we agreed to do, you see, and don't mean to; how let us compromise. Land or nothing, old fel, I've got the start of you. This is like the man who owes you money on a promissory note, and offers to pay you with another note—or nothing. And this is parson Webb!

He will be ashamed of himself in a few days. Better stick to the simple text, Mr. Telegraph, be honest, straightforward, and leave law quibbles to Mr. Ireland. Ox cart Ireland can make black appear white, perhaps, but you have not learned the trick yet. It requires a good deal of peculiar training, and not unfrequently a large fee, to accomplish a man for the advocacy of a bad and very disreputable cause.

THERE is no one in history more honored than discoverers, explorers, path-finders. If Fremont had never acquired the title of path-finder he would never have been a candidate for the Presidency, and consequently would never have been defeated. He discovered a peak in the Rocky Mountains many years ago which until this day is called Fremont's Peak, whereby Fremont is immortal. But we have an equally an-gacious path-finder in Western Texas—which his name is Ireland. He has been to and returned from Austin several times in his life, from the village where he raises the legal roost, and other sagacious persons have done the same thing; but it was reserved unto him to discover only a day or two since a shorter path than the capital to Seguin than any heretofore known. That path does not lead the "solitary traveler" through San Marcos. San Marcos is no longer a "way-station" on that route, and the discoverer is Ireland and more consoling to the other side of the Arkansas River, or as sparklingly

great Statesman of Seguin tearing through his streets at breakneck speed on his tried and trusty mule. His is the short cut on the other side. Of course the great objection in which this great constitutional lawyer is now held by the people of that town, in consequence of his recent friendly course towards Western Texas on railway questions, has had nothing to do with the discovery of that "short cut." The discovery of other short cuts may be expected after awhile.

BARNES efforts are being made in other States to suppress the circulation of obscene, immoral, and libelous newspaper publications. It is a worthy undertaking, and approved by every right minded person. Woodhall and Claffin have given an impetus to the work, and aroused a virtuous energy. Probably nothing has retarded the steady growth of the popularity of the EXPRESS during the past year so much as the reputation which it acquired while under the management of persons who now besmear the columns of the once respectable Austin Journal. It is always easier to acquire a bad reputation than a good one; but it is more difficult to grov out of a bad one than to originally create a good one. The incubi of this paper ceased to have any influence over it when its present editor took charge of its columns, but they are now busily engaged in befouling the State Journal which ought to be the leading and standard Republican paper of the State. We make the assertion "more in sorrow than in anger;" but since experience exerts no influence over the unbalanced trio who rejoice in depravity and scurrility, we suggest that perhaps a proper law stringently enforced might have a wholesome effect.

The Post Office Bill.

The Senate Committee on Appropriations have agreed to report the not making appropriations for the service of the Post Office Department. One of the amendments authorizes the Postmaster General to appoint an additional special agent to detect and punish persons engaged in sending obscene matter through the mails. Another amendment provides that in case any railroad company now furnishing railway post office cars shall refuse to furnish such cars, such company shall not be entitled to any increase of compensation under any provision of the act. The only way in which the provisions of the House bill relating to postal cards is amended is to give the railroad companies increased compensation in proportion to the length of car used. The committee also agreed to report an amendment which provides that no free matter whatever shall be transmitted through the mails. This deprives the newspapers of the country of free exchange, and will compel them to pay postage on their exchanges if it becomes a law.

Thurloe Wood's "Recollections of Horace Greely" is published in the March number of the Galaxy. It is an article of very great interest. The peculiar and very intimate relations which these two great politicians held toward each other will live with an unusual charm all that Mr. Wood, the only surviving partner of the old political firm of Wood, Weed, and Greely, has to say about the junior partner. The article contains several letters of Mr. Greely's never before published. General Grant's recollections of "My Life on the Plains" is continued; also, Mrs. Edwards' and De Forest's serials, and a new story by Turgeon appears. Altogether the March Galaxy is a number of unusual interest.

The Terre Haute Express says: "A great sensation was produced on Main street, yesterday afternoon, by a small but ambitious dog who was no apparition but a sin can leaped gracefully to his tail. The canine moved with the swiftness of the wind—"of the sidewalk wind, Keowayde—"along the sidewalk. One honest burgher was treated as though he were a Colossus of Rhodes, the dog passing between his legs. A leader maiden, a bright and airy thing, weighing only 100 pounds, was toppled into the gutter. Business was suspended, as it were. Men smiled approvingly, and the juvenile population shed tears of delight. No one knows where the dog stopped. He is not registered at any city hotel. He may be ranging yet."

A Kansas man got up a private earthquake, the other day, by placing several pounds of powder in the stove to clear the smoke out of the pipe. To make it all go out of the stove pipe, he shut the door, and placing his feet against it, heroically awaited the result. As that was the only house within five miles, the funeral over the fragments was held in the open air.

All that the President proposes in relation to Utah is that the Federal courts be subordinated to the local courts and their action nullified by local judgments. Essentially, the power of Mormonism has been supreme. It has managed to evade the enforcement of any law or decision that conflicted with the peculiar code and practice established by Brigham Young.

The tidal wave of political progress seems to have reached Austria, and she is awaiting for direct action by the people.

The Washington Chronicle says: "General Howard has, we are informed, made an elaborate reply to the communication of General Vincent, in which he vindicates his administration of the Freedmen's Bureau, shows the completeness of his settlements, and maintaining by evidence presented, that the affairs of the Bureau were in excellent condition when the transfer was made. He claims that the confusion and loss of papers must have resulted from a want of care in the transfer on the part of the agents of the War Department."

The last scandal at Washington implicates United States Judge Charles T. Sherman, of Cleveland, Ohio, and indirectly his brother, one of the Senators from Ohio. It is alleged that Judge Sherman agreed, for \$10,000 to "argue" the repeal of an important tax before the Finance committee of the Senate and the Appropriation committee of the House, John Sherman being chairman of the former, and Mr. Garfield of the latter. That in many, the Judge of one of the United States District Courts agreed to become a Washington lobbyist for a contingent fee of \$10,000, which we believe was paid to him. Further light is promised; but if the allegations already made shall be fully sustained, the effect will be to seriously stain Judge Sherman's official robes. It will prove a very discreditable act, though perhaps not an impeachable offense.

The St. Louis Democrat says: "The Texas journals are rejoicing over the announcement that after the 1st of March the rates on cattle cars from Denver to St. Louis, on the Missouri, Kansas and Texas road, will be much reduced. One of the best-informed men in that State is confident that 200 (x) head of cattle, requiring 10,000 cars to transport them, will be brought into St. Louis over this line during the present year. This, added to our present trade from other sources, will make St. Louis the great cattle mart of the world."

**Change in the Agricultural Association.**  
REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE.  
As many of the friends of this Association are not aware of the change that has been made, we have been requested to publish our future program.

Instead of the one dollar donation demanded each year from all the members, as heretofore, the by-laws have been changed, and the annual fee fixed at \$25.00, which will be placed upon the market, with not more than \$5 per share to be collected in any one year, and it is not likely that more than two or three instalments will ever be called.

A considerable number of shares have already been sold, and the share holders will meet at the Recorder's office, on Saturday, the 27th inst., to elect their officers for one year. The new Board of Directors will, no doubt, purchase the seven acres of land lying immediately on the ditch and adjoining the present Fair Ground, part of the track being on it, and so contiguous, that no present buildings can be used as heretofore. The upper line is within a few feet of our stable. We propose to secure this tract, lay it off, with gravelled walks, erect a large and slightly windmill, and have a fountain playing in various places; to employ an experienced Horticulturist, who will plant the grounds with rare flowers, shrubs, and trees, and we will make the garden more than self-supporting by making it imperative upon all visitors, before entering, to purchase a bouquet of flowers of the value of at least twenty-five cents. We propose to make a new arena, and erect an amphitheatre, where stock can be shown to more advantage and the people seated and protected from rain or sun.

We propose to hold our fairs about the first of June, when our flowers, fruits and vegetables are at their best, and before the dry season sets in. We can exhibit every thing grown in the country except cotton and wheat at that date.

We do not, of course, expect to accomplish all this in one year, but we shall commence and move steadily forward. This Association has perpetual lease to its use, of the San Pedro Spring Park, from the City, and also has, from J. J. Dunbar, about one thousand dollars worth of property. All this, and the additional piece of land, which Messrs. Adams & Wickes very generously propose to sell to this Association at cost, will become the property of the share-holders, and will, in time, be very valuable.
