We have our own theory regard. ing President Grant, and it is a reasonable one, and does not embrace a third term at all. Grant, Democrat. Reared with Democratic surroundings, all his life spent in Democratic associations, grounded in the Democratic faith, it, was not till a war of sections was inevitably begun that he took any interest or part in it. His career to that war was marked by evidences of his Democratic feelings, though the ambition of the soldier and the oppor tunity afforded by the failure of less able generals, backed by a million and a half of soldiers, enabled him to come out of the war with fame and a popularity that commanded the highest honors the Northern people could pay. At that day, Democracy in the North was very much in the condition of Radicalism in Texas to day. Copperheads, as they were called, were a mere laction. All the best people were Republicans, and no man in any State could command votes for the smal lest office, except within that organ ization. Principles that could be counted as distinctive, broad and national, they did not bave. Hundreds of thousands of Northern Democrats, who had sustained the Government in its coercive measares, like Grant affiliated with the Republican party, because they could affiliate nowhere else. But the Democratic principle was still alive, and it has asserted itself upon occasions of impending crisis more than once for the good of the coun-try. No where did it do such servto Grant in his veto of the inflation bill.

General Grant has, in the several acts above enumerated, simply obeyed the dictates of this Democratic feeling, and acted without re gard to those who voted for him for the Presidency, but solely under a sense of responsibility for the wel-dare of the country. He has acted, moreover, with a better sense of his own tame, and with a disregard of the change of another election. He is making a record now, not for anothe canvass, but for the just judg-ment of the historian. He is doing it not for an ambition for office, but for a higher ambition—to be well remembered and well bonored in the history of these times. He pre fers to retire with the lasting regard of all parties to further risk in public life.—Houston Tel.


