

THE charges of Theodore Tilton against Henry Ward Beecher are too grave to be passed over in silence by the person against whom they are directed. Whether true or false, they give such a point and coherency to scandalous rumors which have been floating about for a year or two past, that the real weight must be promptly and satisfactorily ascertained.

THE action taken by the State Department in the "Virginia" mat ter has been in strict accordance with the agreement made last winter between Secretary Fish and Admiral Polo. 


