THE PRAIRIE BURNERS are again abroad. Prairie fires have been raging for a month past in various directions from this city. Last evening the fires were seen within two or three miles of town. The young timber on all the burned region, the growth of years, has all been destroyed, and the prairies are again a treeless, shadeless, desert waste. We have sent the most of the cattle thieves to the Penitentiary, and now the time has come to begin en the prairie incendiaries. If the law does not send them to the Penitentiary, they should be caught, whipped, tarred and feathered, and then made to leave the country. And those who set the prairies on fire through carelessness, should, after the first offense, be treated just like those who do it maliciously. The damage done to the country can never be repaired during the life-time of the present generation, and the strictest vigilance and the severest punishments must be resorted to. Official negligence has done a vast deal of the harm already inflicted.

No man has a right to criticise the conduct of a newspaper unless he pays for it."

Our people seem to forget that the only way to secure good, live and valuable newspapers in our city is to subscribe for them and pay for them. They seem also to forget that no city can be built up without live newspapers, and a newspaper-reading population. The Texas newspapers have made Texas what she now is in the estimation of the world-They have built her railroads, schools, towns, manufactories, populated her waste places, advertised her lands and added ten-fold to their value. And they have done all this work almost gratis. The newspaper men have done more valuable work for the State than any other class of men, and have given more help to all other classes of business, and yet have been less benefitted themselves, than any

other class of men in the State. San Antonio will have to change in this respect, or she will linger along for another 170 or 180 years, a slow, sluggish, un progressive, unproductive city; unles indeed, the newspaper men, and the few progressive men among us, can succeed in importing a new class of citizens and business men here. In the Northern States and even as low down as Kansas, towns half the size of San Antonio have lively, vigorous, and interesting newspapers, and everybody reads them. The people support the newspapers, and therefore the papers are strong and vigorous; the people are inspired by the newspapers, and therefore they are enterprising and progressive. Nothing can be done with a population that does not read the newspapers. They are cut oft from the intelligence, the spirit, the life of the time, just as a branch is cut off from the vine; and they are therefore uninformed, uninspired, unvitalized, and practically dead to the public life of the world and the time. To such people it matters not whether they live in the present century or in the centuries before Christ; in America or in Asia.

UNITED STATES.

PASSED AT THE FIRST SESSION OF THE FOR-TY-THIRD CONGRESS.

[GENERAL NATURE-No. 63.] AN ACT to fix the time for the election of Representatives in the Forty fourth Congress from the State of Mississippi.

(Continued.) SEC. 4. That for the support of the government of the District of Columbia, and maintaining the credit thereof, for the fis-cal year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and seventy five, there shall be levied upon all real estate in said District, except that, belonging to the United States and to the District of Columbia, and that used for educational and charitable purposes, the following taxes namely: Upon all such real estate in the city of Wash-ington, three dollars on each one hundred dollars of the present assessed value thereof; upon all such real estate in the city of Georgetown, two dollars and fifty cents on each one hundred dollars of the present assessed value thereof; and upon all such real estate in the District of Columbia outside of the cities of Washington and Georgetown, two dollars on each one hundred dollars of the present ass-ssed value thereof: which said taxes shall become due and payable on the first day of November, eighteen bundred and seventy-four, and, if not paid, shall be in arrears and delin-quent from that date; and shall, except as herein modified, be assessed and collected as now provided by law for the assessment and collection of general taxes for the District of Columbia; and of the sums so collected, one fourth thereof shall be applied, first to re imburse the United States for its advances on account of interest which shall have been paid by the United States on the funded debt of the District of Columbia and Washington and Georgetown, due and payable July first, eighteen hundred and seventy four; and the re-mainder shall be used to pay deficiencies in the various funds for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and seventy-four. And all the remainder of said taxes not required for the aforcsaid purposes shall be distributed for the purpose and in the proportions provided by the act of the legislative assembly of the District Columbia, approved June twenty-sixth, aghteen hundred and seventy-three, entitled "An act imposing taxes for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and seventy-four," so far as said apportionment is not inconsistent with this act: Provided, That no evidence of debt issued by the District of Columbia, or any branch thereof, or by the board of public works, shall in any manner be received in payment for raid taxes: And provided further, That no payment shall be made on account of the miof erecting a District jail. Upon all ments of said taxes hereby imposed which shall be made in advance of the said first day of November, eighteen hundred and and seventy-four, there shall be an abatement allowed of one per centum per month for each and every month so paid in advance; and that upon all said taxes which shall be delinquent and unpaid on said, first day of November; there shall be added a penalty of one per centum to the amount thereaf, to be collected with such taxes; and a like penalty of one percertum upon the amount thereof shall be added on the first day of each succeeding month to all of said taxes as are then delinquent and unpaid, to be collected as aforesaid. It shall be the duty of the collector of taxes to prepare a complete list of all taxes and property upon which the same are assessed in arrears on the first day of March next, and shall, within ten days thereaf ter, puctish the same, with the notice of a newspaper published in said Dia triet, to be designated by said board of commissioners, for the time and in the manner required by the provisions of the act of the legislative assembly entitled "An act prescribing the duties of certain officers for the District of Columbia, and fixing their compensation," approved August twenty-third, eighteen hundred and seventy one. And all the provisions of

SEC. 5. That a joint select committee shall be appointed, consisting of two Senators, to be appointed by the presiding of-ficer of the Senate, and two members of the House, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, whose duty it shall be to prepare a suitable frame of government for the District of Columbia of government for the District of Common and appropriate draughts of statutes to be enacted by Congress for carrying the same into effect, and report the same to the two Houses reopectively, on the first day of the next session thereof; and they shall also prepare and submit to Congress a atatement of the proper proportion of the expenses of said government, or any branch thereof, including interests on the funded debt, which should be borne by said District and the United States, respectively, together with the reasons upon which their conclusions may be based; and in the discharge of the duty hereby imed, said committee is authorized to employ such assistance as it may deem adviscable, at an expense nyt to exceed the sum of five thousand dollars; and said


